He was one of the ZL7AA / ZM7A Napier team that operated from the Chatham Islands in 1993. At home Reid was geared up for VHF and did listened on the HF bands.

Reid was Manager of Agnews shop in Napier until it closed and then became Mr fixit at his brother's engineering works for about 7 years. He had always been into photography amongst other technical interests and had earlier been Manager of Camera House in Napier. Reid also had a driving school for some years. He trained and worked as a cabinetmaker in his younger years. Reid's wife Hine has been unwell but was able to be present in a wheelchair at Reid's service.
