Taraponui 725 Repeater

It's now just over 30 years since the Napier Amateur Radio club established the 147.25 repeater on Taraponui. I don't recall who kicked the idea off, but Taraponui was chosen as a site largely because it would give good coverage of the Napier-Taupo highway, and Peter ZL2IK and your scribe ZL2TC were technicians employed by two of the three Govt. departments who had radio services on the site, and had access to the site in the course of our employment. Commercial FM repeater equipment was not widely available at that time, and in any case was beyond our budget, so we decided to purchase a Waikato VHF Group repeater kitset. I built up the repeater, and Peter ZL2IK undertook to construct a duplexer from some surplus 80 MHz cavity filters (which is still in use today), and we had it up and running from a temporary site in the old CD headquarters on Bluff Hill in time for the QB weekend NZART Conference. The performance of the repeater wasn't all that great, and Peter and I decided that the Waikato kit receiver wasn't up to it, so I converted a surplus AWA VHF receiver to FM and fitted it in place of the original receiver, with a drastic improvement in performance. The photo shows the repeater chassis, receiver on the right, with the VHF receiver front end in the screened box at the rear, and the transmitter on the left.

Next trick was to get it installed at Taraponui, so it was initially installed in the MWD repeater hut, and later, following an approach by David ZL2DW to his then employer, we were able to install it in the NZ Electricity repeater hut , with a 4 - dipole colinear antenna. Coverage exceeded all expectations from the outset. Unfortunately, the Taraponui site is prone to savage ice storms during winter, and the 4 dipole colinear took a bit of a battering, and eventually had to be replaced with a more robust commercial 2 dipole array. Later developments on the Taraponui site with more commercial services meant a move to the new building, and the old Waikato repeater replaced with a commercial Tait unit, with the dipole array shifted to the Transpower microwave tower, much as it is today (photos in previous Break-Out)

It kept us occupied on air from 8pm Sat. night until 2am Sunday morning at the Guides/Scout Camp east of Hastings near Haumoana. We ran dipole aerials on 80m (CW mode) and 160m (Phone mode). There was much frustration being able to hear and not work many VK stations but we did manage a few but it certainly was not our best year, our guys on 80m/CW made similar comments. ZL event stations with large/gain aerials seemed to have the edge over our dipoles but having said that our contact numbers were creditable but the VK multipliers were not as we had hoped.

We can at least be happy with our "Boys Weekend Away". Many thanks to those who worked us, every point helps.

The Silver Fern Car Rally 2012
