

While on the subject of antennas, most will have read on the various reflectors of the Nelson antenna saga, where a disgruntled neighbor has publicly objected (via the news media) to the presence of a tri-band loop, even though it complies with local council by-laws. It's worth reading the judgement handed down by the Environment Court judge in the Tauranga case, where he noted the role amateurs play in emergency communications, and are a valuable community resource, and should be permitted to have back-yard antennas as of right.

However, if you are going to erect an antenna, make sure it complies with local council rules, and it doesn't hurt to have a chat to your neighbors, even though you don't need their consent.

A lot of amateur radio activities over the next couple of months, VHF Convention over Easter weekend, the great Wanganui junk sale returns on 4th May, followed by the REG sale in Hamilton the following weekend, and NZART Conference in Masterton on QB weekend.

In the meantime, keep those rigs warm.


