This month has been a busy month for amateur radio in Hawkes Bay. Last weekend the 2 wheel drive rally saw 16 hams help out with comms for the car rally in the Gwavas forest. Extreme weather conditions meant some volunteers ended up with some vehicle damage. This is leading to a safety plan for us, as we are often onsite well before rally officials are there, thus we act as their eyes and ears. Other than that the day went fairly well, weather considered.

This weekend we had our annual search and rescue exercise. Strong winds and the threat of sporadic heavy rain also loomed, and at one point one of the search teams almost became a lost party. The base at Robson's lodge had no 240V power and this showed up a few weaknesses in our preparedness. We managed to try out 9675 and our STSP digipeater for APRS. Both worked well.

Next weekend is a four day weekend for those of us in Hawkes Bay. On the Saturday is our local junk sale at Pakowhai Hall. Entry is \$2 and this gets you an entry into the raffle. Come and buy some surplus used equipment, have some food, and catch up with fellow hams from the district, as well as guests from outside the area.

The last weekend of October is CQ world wide weekend. The most highly participated contest each year, this will generate plenty of activity on HF. Visit www.cgww.com for more information and contest rules.

Branch 25 Napier News...

The next Napier meeting is the AGM and Pan Pac trophy contest on Wednesday 7 November at 7.30 pm at the clubrooms. Bring along your homebrewed projects and enter them in the Pan Pac trophy contest.

At the last meeting Laurie ZL2TC gave us a rundown on how Trunked Mobile operates throughout NZ. Some similarities with cellular service and some big differences too. Thanks Laurie.

Last month we reported the passing of Gordon ZL2NF. During this last week Gordon's XYL Ida also passed away.

In preparation for the CQ Worldwide SSB contest the ZM2M team have been busy tidying up antennae at the Tangoio farm site with much co-operation from farmer Jim. We had a welcome visit from Chris ZL2DX from Martinborough with his homebuilt 'spud' gun - an air operated 'gun' that shoots spuds into the air. The gun consists of two cylinders, a pump and a battery operated valve. One cylinder is charged to about 100-150 pounds/sq inch with a hand pump, a neat fitting spud is inserted into the other cylinder and when the valve is electrically opened the spud is propelled a great distance. In our case as well as a spud we had a fairly neat fitting insulator outside the spud with a nylon fishing line attached. When fired the spud and insulator took off right over the top of the 100 ft high trees and landed amongst the trees. The most difficult part was locating the insulator and line. After some practice runs we managed two lines over the tops of trees to hold our dipole antennae for the low bands.

More recently we had a very successful morning planting an old telephone pole in a hole that we made on the farm and we now have a substantial support to which we can erect a mast with triband beam on top, alongside to compliment the existing 20 metre beam adjacent to the workshop. We have fitted rungs on the sides to enable 'someone' to climb to the top to lock the mast when it is raised beside the pole. The hole was made with a posthole borer and the pole erection was done with the aid of a digger.

HF band conditions have improved with the equinox and we are hopeful of lots of DX activity on the last weekend of October. Lots of Dxpeditions are promised for this period so we just need good conditions. Amongst the Dxpeditions and in our own backyard is a Polish group operating now from the Chathams using their home calls/ZL7 until about the end of the

The Last Bit

Well its been a busy ham month for with the 2 wheel drive car rally and the SARex last weekend. They both had extra dramas that were unexpected. We had massive winds on the car rally which caused major problems for us and the rally organisers. We had two cars damaged and a mast fell over that held the aerial that was providing the car club comms. The aerial was reinstated but still no comms – it looks like their repeater is on the blink so ZL2AJ became the human repeater and passed messages on their network as required. The wind was so bad that one stage was abandoned completely as it was too windy for the start control personnel to be able to work.

The SARex was running well then we sent some gear back to Hastings on the Saturday night as being "no longer required". The weather was packing in so the lost party got found quickly on Saturday early evening then we had to get the searchers out and back to base. The comms were working really well when one of the search parties were crossing a swollen river. They crossed once and all ok then said they were going to cross the river again to find a suitable area to stay the night. That was the last time we heard them. It was felt that there was a chance that things may have gone badly wrong so an attempt was made to get the Lowe Walker Helicopter in to check on things but of course the weather had closed in and they couldn't get to us. The only thing we could do was head off to bed and try and get in to them in the morning. We had comms up at 0545 and a party were heading in from the road end towards the last known position of the team. At 0615 we had a call on HF from the team – they were ok. They hadn't realised that the repeater they were talking to was behind a bluff that they had moved under. In the end it was all ok and was actually good to have a bit of a "sharpening up" as things had gotten a bit rusty with the lack of searches.
