History of Hastings

Celebrating a City - September 1956

Text kindly taken from Matthew Wrights' book – Town and Country, "The History of Hastings and District," Published by Hastings District Council 2001

n Saturday 8th September 1956, Hastings' official elevation to city status began. Events began at 11.45am with a 'transport throughout the ages' parade down Heretaunga Street, followed by massed bands and marching team. At 1.30pm, the Governor-General Sir Willoughby Norrie arrived at Nelson Park and after welcomes, the Mayor of Hastings HE Bates read his speech concluding with the following words:

"It remains for us all, of this generation to enter into this grand inheritance with a proper sense of responsibility to our city and district. None of us lives alone. Each of us influences our day for good or ill. All of us can spare some time to advance the welfare of our community. Thus we go forward from this day enjoying a new status, with more advantages than those enjoyed by our earlier settlers and administrators and moreover inspired by their example to build a still bigger and better city in which our children will grow up happy, prosperous and proud of what we shall have accomplished."

At 3.40pm the Proclamation was read by the Governor General, and there was a flyover by four De Havilland DH 100 Vampires.

Other Events followed during the week, including a Children's' Day, featuring an open-air skating carnival at Windsor Park; an 'Old Identities Day'; a production of 'Rose Marie' by the Hastings Musical Comedy Club and performances by the Hastings Citizens Band, Salvation Army Band and Hastings Scots Highland Pipe Band. Saturday September 15th was the Blosson Parade.

Fifties music will be played from time to time in the background and a group of Hastings Girls High students called "Oh My Gosh" will perform a slot of singing at 3.45 pm on Monday 11th September.



A special viewing corner will be dedicated to showing DVD recorded excerpts from the TV hit programmes "Get Smart" and "Happy Days" as well as a locally produced video of the Blossom Parades over the years.

Hastings Blossom Festival September 15 - 24 Parade day, September 16.

he Hastings Blossom Festival has been part of the history of Hastings from the early 1950s. An enthusiastic group of citizens known as Greater Hastings were behind its beginnings and the festival soon became nationally known.

The festival celebrates the arrival of spring, a season that is tremendously important to a region that relies on growing things for much of its wealth. Pastoral, horticultural and viticultural industries are central to the Hastings District and they all rely on a good start to the growing season.

When the blossoms start arriving we know that the end of winter is in sight. The festival helps us all to mark the change of season and the beginnings of another productive cycle.

The spring festival went into recess in 1973 but it was revived again in 1988. The parade waited until 1993 to make a reappearance and when it did, thousands turned out to see it. Hastings had not forgotten its Blossom Parade.

The festival is now a ten day entertainment feast. It was recognised this year, by being awarded the Creative New Zealand's cultural festival and arts events award. It has become once again very much part of our region's life.

The Blossom Queens Return

To help celebrate the 50th anniversary of Hastings becoming a city, we have tracked down eight of the former Blossom Queens. They will take part in the parade in classic cars of their era.

Blossom Carnival

In the early days of the festival, the carnival rides were very much part of the celebration. They came back again for the first time last year and in 2006 they are here for the whole of the Parade Weekend. The whole fairground atmosphere is lots of fun. The sideshows offer you all sorts of activities, from popping the ball in the mouth of the clown to knocking over tin teeth with a slug gun. The Screamer and the Hurricane are very popular rides for the thrill seekers and there are also small rides for the little kids. The carnival starts on Friday evening and runs all through Saturday until 10.30pm at night and again on Sunday until 4pm.

Free Lunchtime Concerts

Every weekday, starting on Friday 15 September, there will be free lunchtime concerts at St Matthews. The concerts run from 12.10pm until 1pm. They feature some of our best young secondary school musicians, including students from Hastings Girls High, Iona College, Karamu High School and Woodford House. There are also two organ recitals, from Stephen Rowley and Gary Bowler. The concerts are free, but donations are invited for Cranford Hospice.



Free Festival Fireworks

A giant free fireworks show is a highlight of the final weekend of the festival. The evening starts at 7pm with music from local band, Borderline, and the fireworks hurtle into the sky at 8.30pm. This year we are going to have a special fireworks salute to the 50th anniversary so look out for something special. There are food stalls or you can bring a picnic. A fantastic family event.




Hastings City Spanish Mission

astings' Spanish Mission architecture was largely overlooked until the 1980s. Anyone interested in architecture would have cast a cordial eye over the wonderful Westermans Building, and possibly noted that all the other buildings in that block of Russell Street were complimentary to it. And they would probably have been impressed by the Municipal Theatre (now the Opera House), but might have been more impressed by its extraordinary Art Nouveau interior than its Spanish Mission exterior. But it was not until Napier had started talking about its Art Deco buildings that Hastings began to realise that it too had a rich and unique heritage townscape, although ironically, Napier has more Spanish Mission buildings than Hastings and Hastings probably has more Art Deco than Napier. But Napier's finest buildings are Art Deco, and Hastings' finest are Spanish Mission.

But the other 20th century styles in Hastings – Edwardian, Art Deco and Stripped Classical - make a huge contribution to this townscape. Most of the 1930s buildings were designed either by the firm of Davies & Phillips in variations of the Art Deco style, but in a manner quite different from Napier's buildings.

The book Spanish Mission Hastings – Style of Five Decades was published in 1991 as a companion volume to Art Deco Napier – Style of the Thirties, which had been released in 1989. Both books are by Peter Shaw, with photographs by Peter Hallett. The text is comprehensive, exploring the architectural history of Hastings from its earliest days, with many black & white photographs, many of them of buildings which are no longer with us. The colour section illustrates buildings as we know them today, with two exceptions being buildings that have been altered and don't look quite as good as they looked in 1991.

The new book contains many new photographs, some of them of buildings which were not included in the first book, while some other buildings which are not normally visible to the public have been omitted. However, the book still includes a number of the fine country homesteads in the Hastings District. The photos that are reused have been rescanned, using today's scanning technology, bringing their quality up to the equal of the new digital photos.

Johnny Devlin Rock 'n Roll Legend

16 September, Saddles Room at Hawke's Bay Racing Centre, Hastings.

Johnny Devlin was New Zealand's first rock 'n roll star and the first Kiwi recording artist to earn a gold record. He was also the first New Zealand rocker to cross the Tasman, the beginning of a long, influential and fruitful

Johnny kick-started his own career at the age of 12, when he got his first guitar and taught himself to play. After discovering Elvis Presley, Johnny's life changed and by 1956 Devlin was performing solo and became known for the wild hair and 'hepcat' slang . He won every talent quest he entered with his Elvis Presley impersonation and by 1958 he had released his version of Elvis Presley's version of Lloyd Price's 'Lawdy Miss Clawdy' on Phil Warren's Prestige label.

Without any airplay on New Zealand's Government controlled radio the record went on to top the charts and sold 100,000 copies. He followed by releasing a series of singles with his group, The Devils, and became a major attraction, creating riots and news wherever he went. Johnny Devlin and the Devils were New Zealand teenagers' access to the rock and roll age.

He decided to try his luck in Australia and with his flamboyant lame, tiger skin and satin stage costumes, earned him the nickname 'Satin Satan'. In 1964 Devlin re-entered the limelight as part of the Beatles tour in both Australia and New Zealand. In 1965 Devlin took his talents to England, hoping for a shot at international fame where he recorded singles for CBS, returning to Australia in 1967 to establish himself as a regular performer on Australian's clubs and

THE HEAT SHOPS

Golden Queens and Silver Tureens

Story of Hastings history brought to life

itled Golden Queens and Silver Tureens, the official exhibition marking 50 years of Hastings' city status, sets out to capture the essence of a city created and built through the ambition, determination and hard work of its citizens.

Months of preparation have gone into the show, which tells the story of early Hastings by focusing on its founding forefathers and how they contributed to the town's steady growth, from the time of the original Heretaunga land purchase through to the post-war economic boom.

A prized exhibit is the loyalty sword given by Queen Victoria to prominent Maori chief Henare Tomoana in 1868, in recognition of his valour in the campaign against Maori spiritual leader Te Kooti.

The sword is passed down through the Tomoana family to the descendant attaining rank within the New Zealand armed forces. The current caretaker is Steven Tomoana who is now living in Australia and has allowed the sword to be flown to Hastings for the show.

Other Hastings ancestors profiled in the exhibition include William Nelson, widely regarded as the father of the modern day freezing industry, Sir James Wattie, one of the outstanding New Zealanders of the 20th century, and James Nelson Williams, the first to identify the potential for a commercial fruit growing and processing industry in Hastings.

Williams' planted the famed 60 miles of peach trees on his Frimley orchard and opened the Frimley Canning Factory in 1904. Some of the original cannery glass jars have been located for the exhibition.

A call for memorabilia has unearthed other treasures, such as a cameo brooch containing locks of hair from seven of the nine children born during the first marriage of meat industry captain William Nelson.

Hastings Exhibition Centre staff have also recreated the flavour of the golden years in the 50s and 60s, when Hastings flourished on the back of earnings from its rich land and celebrated in style, hosting nationally renowned events such as the Blossom Festival and the Highland Games.

A key attraction will be a short film on the Hastings Blossom Festival made by award-winning New Zealand director Gaylene Preston. Gaylene has blended footage from the New Zealand Film Archives with interviews with three former Blossom Queens - Helena Hannah, who was crowned in 1960, Nicola Hearn, the 1965 queen and the last to hold the title in 1973, Margaret Ross.

oaring above Heretaunga Street, the Royal New Zealand Air Force will celebrate Hastings City's 50th Anniversary on Friday 8 September with a flypast over the blossom city.

The Air Force will be making the most of Hawke's Bay's hospitality as its student pilots deploy on their first ever major exercise. Around a hundred personnel will live and work at Bridge Pa Aerodrome for two weeks in early September on Exercise Wiseowl.

Working away from home, Wiseowl gives the student pilots their first taste of working in the 'field' and flying in unfamiliar territory. The students are on their 'Wings' course and are normally based at the Flying Training Wing at Ohakea.

Flying the distinctive yellow and black CT4 Airtrainers, nine students and their instructors will buzz over the hills of Hawke's Bay. The main focus for the students will be formation flying, so residents within 100 kilometres of Bridge Pa can expect to see pairs of planes flying together throughout the day.

On the ground the Air Force personnel will live and work out of tents at Bridge Pa.

The camp will be self sufficient, with a field kitchen, medical facility, administration unit, communications centre, as well as a maintenance centre for the aircraft.

An open day on 9 September will allow the Hawke's Bay public to get a first hand look at a working Air Force camp.

As well as the two-seater Airtrainers, there will be a C-130 Hercules, Iroquois and Sioux helicopters and Kingair for the public to look through. There will be ground displays by the Air Security dogs, Air Force fire-fighters and armament section - while in the air there will be an array of aerobatics for everyone to enjoy.








