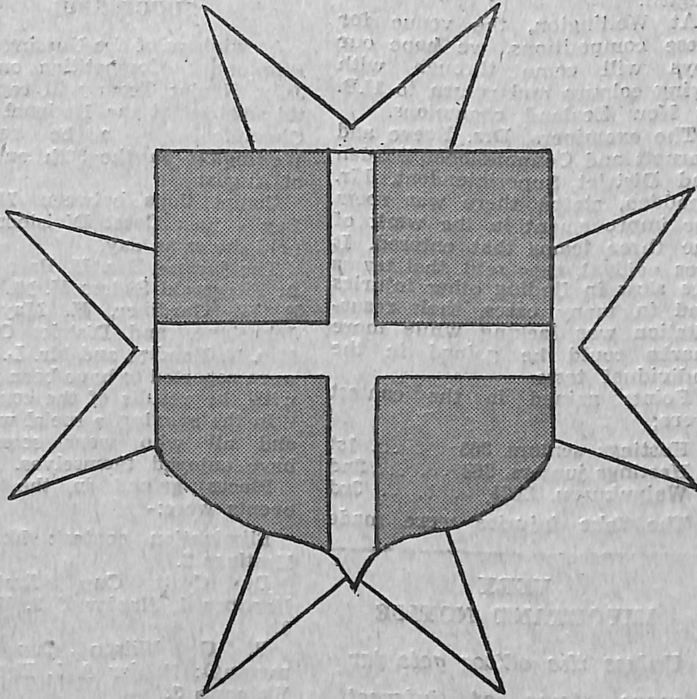

# KEEN COMPETITION IN CADET ELIMINATIONS

## HASTINGS BOYS WIN AT HOMETOWN

Having won by a margin of 100 points gained in the Team Test, the senior team from the Hastings division will represent Hawkes Bay-East Coast District in the Dominion Cadet Competitions in August.

At Wellington, the venue for these competitions, we hope our boys will come through with flying colours and return to H.B. as New Zealand champions.

The examiners, Drs. Reeve and Barnett and Commissioner Barden and District Superintendent, Mr. Snadden, stated there was room for improvement in the work of the three teams that entered. It was evident, they said, that teams are slow in finding other injuries and in many cases, their resuscitation was lacking while more marks could be gained in the individual tests.

Hastings seniors, 363 . . . . . 1st  
Hastings juniors, 263 . . . . . 2nd  
Waipukurau, 262½ . . . . . 3rd

up by District Officer of Cadets, Mr H Taylor who also donated the afternoon tea.
