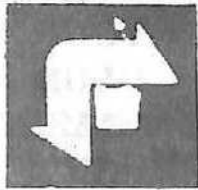

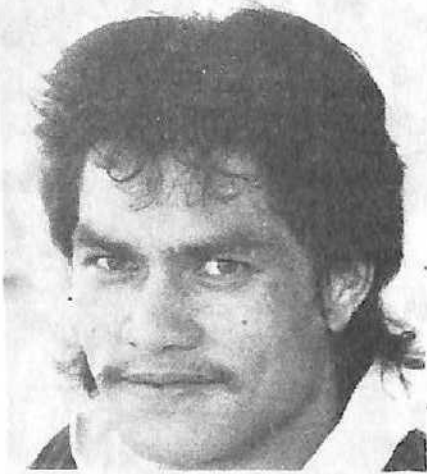

Jeremy Ormond this young Mahia fisherman is one of a crop of highly promising young backs in the Bay. Played for North Island under 16 in 1982 and 83 and climbed up through H.B. under 18 and B teams to make his first class debut in 1986. Injuries and work commitments have restricted his availability but he is certain to add many more appearances to the 20 odd he already has for the Bay.
Age 23 5ft 10in 12st 7lb.
Club Mahia.



Graham McNair a Dannevirke farmer who has progressed through provincial ranks (under 18s in 1979 and 80, Colts in 1984, B's in 1985 and A's in 1986) to become a solid performer in the first class arena. The Dannevirke OB prop played 13 of 16 games in 1986 and three early last season before injury struck. He has taken time to work his way back into reckoning this season but is now approaching 20 caps.
Age 26 6ft 1 in 15st 9 lb.
Club Dannevirke Old Boys.



Matthew Cooper a utility back, in the mould of Otago and former All Black full back brother Greg, who has established himself as a first choice Bay selection since bursting on the scene as an 18 year old in 1985. He won 25 caps before his 20th birthday, already has 50 first class appearances to his credit and is fast approaching the half century for Hawke's Bay. A NZ Colt and All Black to Japan last year.
Age 21 6ft 1in 13st 9lb.
Club Marist.



Shaun Bell burst on to the first class scene last season after only two senior club games. In those outings he impressed enough for selector Richard Hunt to put him in at the deep end against Manawatu. Bell, a North Island under 18 rep., in 1987 and older brother of current NZ Secondary schools fullback Andre, has represented HB through the grades and adds to a group of highly talented young backs in the province. Scored 235 points in club rugby this season.
Age 19 5ft 10in 12st 10lb.
Club Napier Old Boys



Saula Bueta an enthusiastic winger who wants as much action as possible and always dangerous with the ball in hand. He was a Fijian trialist four times and played for his country on three occasions. Since arriving in Hawke's Bay he impressed while playing for Central H.B., got his opportunity against Poverty Bay and stamped himself as a first choice selection.
Age 25 5ft 10in 12st 7 lb.
Club Waipawa United.



Russell Shelford outstanding form for an exciting Pirate side in club rugby this season has this talented midfield back fringing on representative selection. He has worked his way up through H.B. under 16, Colts and B teams and made his first class debut as a replacement against Poverty Bay this season. It can't be long before he gets his first full cap.
Age 26 5ft 11in 13st 4lb.

HAWKE'S BAY PORTRAITS



Stuart Forster one of the most exciting prospects in Hawke's Bay rugby, he forced his way into the team early this season and has been first choice halfback since. Left school last year after three seasons in the Napier BHS First XV and made an immediate impact in club rugby this season. Represented North Island at under 18 level last year.
Age 19 5ft 6in 11st 4lb. Club Napier Old Boys.



Jason McDowell commanded attention at national level after a magnificent game against the touring Welsh. Still a school boy at Napier Boys High where he has been in the First XV for several seasons. He represented New Zealand at under 19 and secondary schools levels in 1987 and 88 and was also a NZ Colt trialist this season. School commitments have restricted this talented fullback-winger to a handful of games for the Bay after his debut against NZ Supporters Club XV.
Age 19 5ft 10in 12st 10lb.
Napier Boys High School First XV.



Alex Mathewson an aggressive hooker who has made a comeback to first class level after some time in the wilderness. Top form for championship winning Hastings Celtic in the Club season forced his recall. A New Zealand Colt in 1982, he played five games for the Bay in 1983 and was a North Auckland reserve in 1984. Battling with Hewitt for the hooking berth this year.
Age 26 5ft 10 1/2in 14st 12lb.
Club Hastings Celtic.



Ash Hamilton a solid scrummager who selector Richard Hunt "found" in Central Hawke's Bay. He represented that sub-union and, apart from injury, has been first choice at tighthead this season after making his debut against the NZ Supporters Club XV.
Age 31 5ft 9in 14st 7lb.
Club Waipukurau HSOB.



Derek Brooks a dashing winger from Dannevirke who played 60 odd games for Wanganui before moving to the Bay in 1985. Eight games for the Bay that season and a further 10 in 1986 stamped him as an integral part of the team and he was missed when unavailable last year. But he's back as keen as ever this season and now has more than 80 first class appearances to his credit.
Age 27 5ft 9in 12st.
Club Aotea.



Mark Shaw the former All Black flanker arrived in Hawke's Bay from Manawatu early 1986 and was quickly installed as captain. He played 11 games that season but was only available for the opening fixture of the 1987 programme (which qualified him for the Bay Blazer). Work commitments prevented him from being available for the first half of this season. But the veteran of more than 200 first class games (including 30 tests) has come back to help the Bay's second division campaign and has taken over the captaincy. Age 32 6ft 2 in 15st 6lb. Club Hastings Celtic.

HAWKE'S BAY PORTRAITS



Graeme Higginson the 1980 - 83 All Black lock who came from Canterbury in 1982. Captained the Bay that season and highlights were 13-12 losses to both Australia and Wellington (Ranfurly Shield challenges). He played 24 games for H.B. in two seasons before moving to the Wairarapa Bush union. Farming and injuries prevented him from playing again until this season when he linked up with the Napier Marist Club and made a comeback to first class rugby. A veteran of 125 first class games (including six tests). Age 33 6ft 4in 16st 7lb. Club Napier Marist.



Paul Renton an uncompromising loose forward who has made steady rise through national ranks since being a NZ Secondary Schools rep in 1980. A NZ Colt in 1983, NZ Junior in 1984, NZ Emerging Player and North Island rep in 1986 and All Black trialist the past two seasons, Renton left the province and represented Manawatu in 1983 and Mid-Canterbury 1984-85. He returned home in 1986 to become a first choice selection for the Bay team. To the end of the last season he had played 61 first class games. Age 25 6ft 2in 15st. Club Hastings HSOB.



John Bird was a NZ Colt in 1981 and played 20 games for the Bay in 1981, '82 and '83 before leaving the province. In those days he played mainly at No. 8 but since arriving back in the Bay last season he has locked the scrum. One of the Magpies' hardest toilers, Bird has played around 40 games for the province and has been rewarded with the captaincy this season. Another Bay player of farming stock and one of several Central H.B. players now playing rugby in Napier of Hastings. Age 26 6ft 4in 16st. Club Napier Marist.



Norman Hewitt another player fresh to first class rugby and the young hooker has impressed sufficiently to earn selection for the Central Zone team. Last season, his first year of Te Aute College, he played for Hawke's Bay Colts and has made an immediate impact in the senior ranks for his club this season. Hewitt is a strong, bustling player and seems set to hold down the No 1 hooking berth. Age 19 5ft 10in 15st 4lb. Club Napier Technical.



Hamish Quinlivan made his first class debut for Hawke's Bay in 1986 and played five games that season. He slipped back to the B team last season but has secured a front row berth in this year's squad. Quinlivan has moved up from Central Hawke's Bay and linked up with the strong Napier Tech team and both parties have benefited. His representative background includes games for NZ Secondary schools, North Island under 18, NZ Universities, Manawatu Colts. Age 27 6ft 2in 16st. Club Napier Technical.



Richard Bartlett a new arrival in the Bay this season with a background of eight games for South Canterbury in the 1983, '84 and '85 seasons, Southern Maoris and Queensland B representative last season. A huge man, Bartlett adds considerable size to the pack and his value to the team should increase with his match fitness during the season. Age 25 6ft 6in 16st 12lb. Club Clive.

THE SECOND DIVISION

All the dire predictions about what might happen to the Hawkeye guys today should not be all in vain. After all, in terms of what is left for the rest of the season, this is a practice match which should relax some of the pressures which exist in other matches when the Bay is striving for competition points and the chance to climb back into the first division of the National Mutual Championship.

Hawke's Bay's toughest opposition in that target are clearly going to be Marlborough, the final home match at Hastings on September 14, and Wairarapa Bush - at Masterton in the competition finale in Masterton on October 1st.

Each now has three convincing championship wins from three matches, while Hawke's Bay have beaten Mid-Canterbury and Southland in their only outings.

All three teams have similar extra incentive for getting into the first division. They've all been there before - Marlborough were there in the first two years (1976-77), Wairarapa Bush had an astounding six seasons in the top grade and reached fourth position in 1985, and Hawke's Bay have spent eight seasons up top, relegated twice and now aiming for the fourth straight season to get back in.

Marlborough represent the most interesting opposition. They're coached by former hooker Kevin Sutherland who was also a consistent goalkicker during a long stint which ended in 1983.

A guide to their form was given by Southland coach Barry Leonard when he was with his team in Hastings. Marlborough, he reckoned, are the team to beat with big, mobile forwards, and lots of pace in the backs - particularly in schoolboy wing threequarter Greg Parke.

Marlborough have given no opposition any chance to date, and all reports rate them an impressive lot which could give the union its greatest season since the halcyon days of Ranfurly Shield triumph and defence in 1973 and 1974.

Wairarapa Bush, on the other hand, have not been impressing their own followers who have been large in number over recent years and have perhaps had too much of a good thing and consequently still shiver in a state of shock which has predominated since their side was ushered out of the first division.

Chief among the concerns of players appears to have been the dumping of coach Roger Dee who was at the helm last season - his first at the first class level. The new man this year is Alan Cornelius who was taking a right knocking from the fans till the second half of his side's match against Mid-Canterbury when they ran in 34 points to win 43 - 6.

In both those teams, mobility appears to be the key to recent success and something which Hawke's Bay needs to develop if it is realistically to be still in the running in a month's time.



Darryl Tamati not an imposing figure on the field but makes up for it with skill and a high work rate. The utility back was a H.B. Colt in 1983 and plucked from senior club ranks into top rugby by his former Hastings HSOB coach Richard Hunt in 1986. A couple of tries in his debut against Poverty Bay justified his selection and has since played nearly 30 games for the province. Plays both on the wing and at halfback in club rugby and is backup in both positions for the Bay.

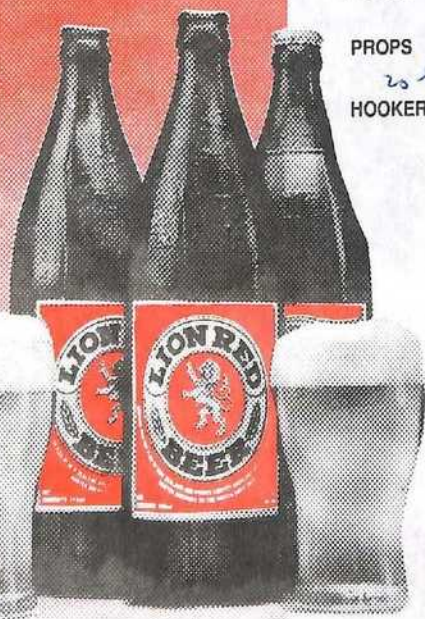

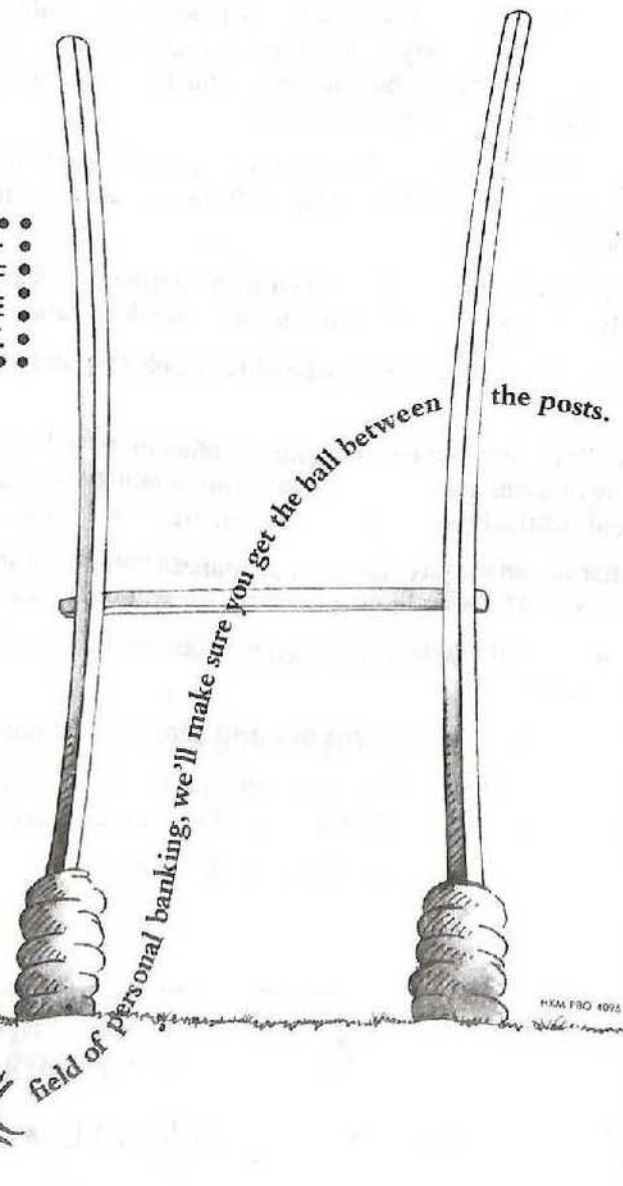

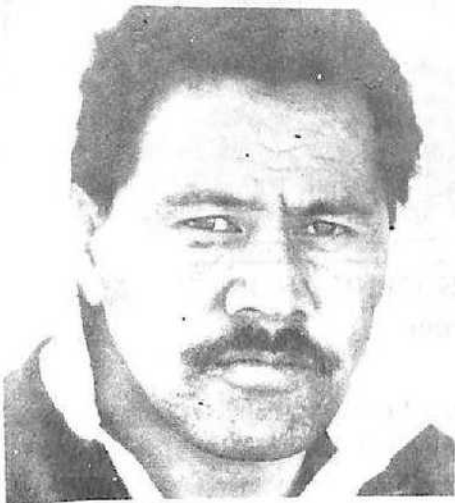

COME ON BACKS - LET'S THINK ABOUT IT by Steve Greer

It's "mind over matter" and "brains before brawn". Mental preparation and awareness and the ability to think quickly and clearly are vital to today's backs.

The more you think about what you are doing out there and communicate your thoughts to others from halfback through to fullback, the easier the playing of the game becomes and the more confident you become. Confidence only comes from thinking about and knowing what you are doing and having the ability to do it.

Of course preparation and training of thought is of upmost importance if you are expecting to produce the goods on the paddock. For instance, if your forwards only have the ability to win 50% of the ball throughout a game then logically your defence is of equal importance to your attack. Yet, how often do you think about and practice and develop a defensive pattern. You will get as much satisfaction out of winning a game when your forwards have won very little ball simply because your defensive pattern was so good your opposition couldn't score a try as you will out of scoring tries because the opposition defence is so weak. In any event a good defensive pattern is a form of attack where the opposition become so frustrated with failure to breach the defense that panic sets in and mistakes abound. Again the ability to capitalize on mistakes assumes the players are interested enough to back up and support and get involved in the game. How many times do you hear "that was a lucky bounce"? You have to be there to get the lucky bounce. Supporting and backing up are absolutely vital and no one should be selected in the backs if they do not have the physical and mental ability to support and back up. If you are not so brilliant on attack to be able to comprehensively beat your opposite number, then the obvious solution is to be there when he is not but doubling around and supporting. Our very own John Timu (now playing for Otago) has the natural ability to attack and do all the above things - he is the complete rugby player - you could learn a lot from watching him.

On the other hand, even more mental preparation and positive thought is required for "attacking backs". The ability to "read a game" is essential to all but more particularly

to halfbacks and flyhalves if the outside backs are to have any chance of successfully operating.

A halfback must know without hesitation when to run blind, when to run open, when and where to pass and when to kick. For example, when the opposition blindside wing consistently stands deep your halfback should be using the blind and you blind side wing. You will nearly always breach the advantage line and linking up of blindside wing, halfback and loose forwards will inevitably produce tries.

The same applies to a halfback fanning towards a blindside wing who has that "horrible habit" of coming in on defence. Keep your blindside wing out wide and once the opposition wing has made one or two steps towards you it is all over. This again applies out wide - bring your extra man in outside centre at pace, allow the opposition wing with the "horrible habit" (and there are plenty of them out there) to come in. Immediately pass to your wing who is mentally tuned to sating out wide and again it is "curtains" to the opposition. But for goodness sake if it works once - think about it - and keep doing it. Play to the opposition's weaknesses but don't spend 90 minutes trying to find them or alternately don't find them in the first five minutes and then forget about them for the remaining 85 minutes.

Likewise, midfield backs, don't spend all day getting knocked down behind the advantage line which is either because (a) the ball is too slow (b) you are too slow (c) you are standing too flat (d) the opposition is very quick or often offside. Alternatively have your flyhalf stand deep rather than wide, giving him the opportunity to probe the blind, run and link with the loose forwards or kick in behind the backs.

Thought variation and communication are an irrepressible combination. If the above sounds easy back, then so is playing the game. But remember the ball always beats the man (try telling Michael Jones that) and every second is 8 metres for the average runner and 8 metres away from the cover defence is good fun.

Practice and put into effect the above and we need not say good luck for the rest of the season.

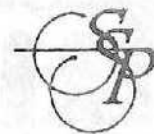

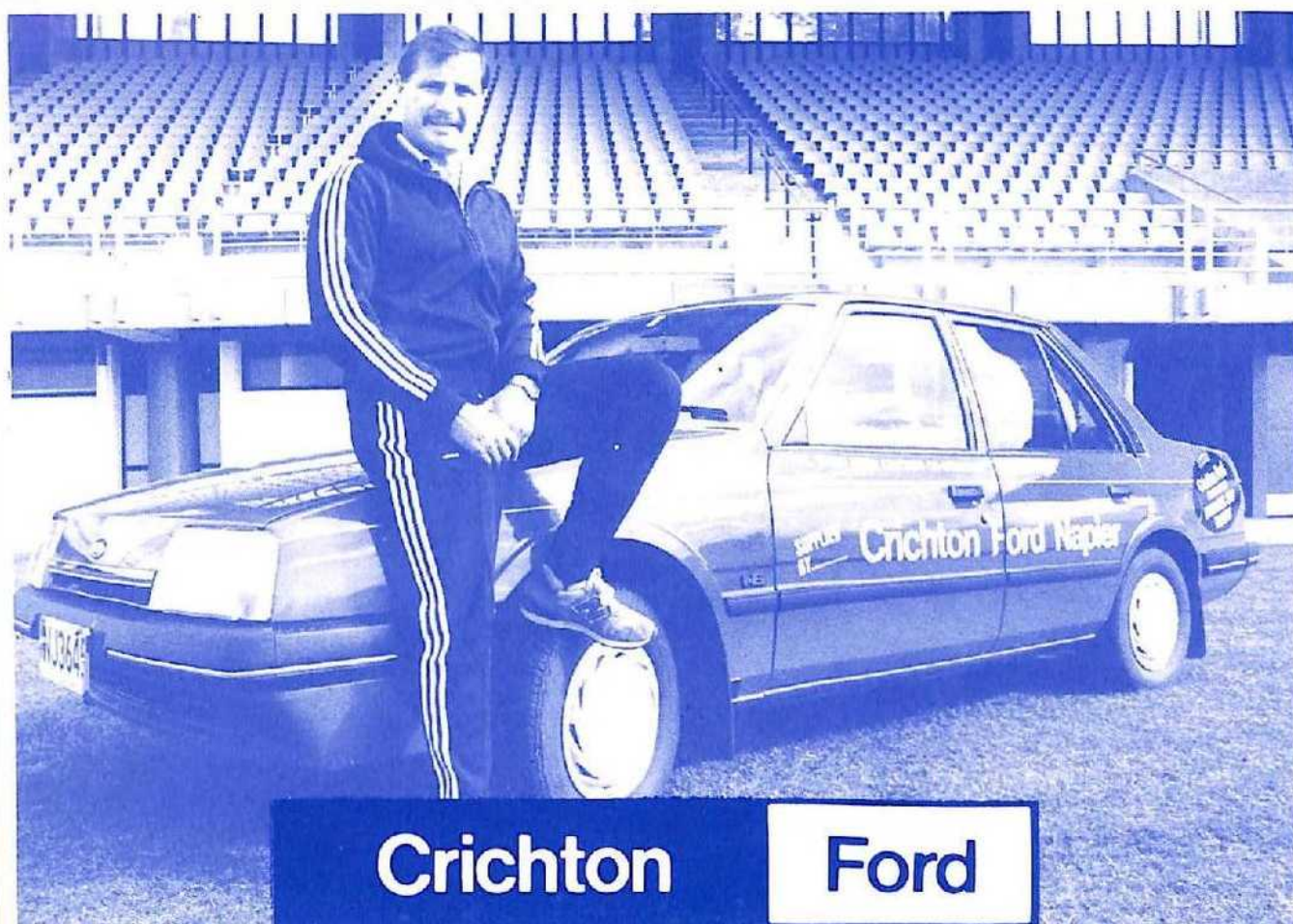
