
Two and a half hours of non-stop, enjoyable entertainment, including comedy and song, presents itself in life-like colour and rollicking action.

The artists, all of whom appeared in the "Miss New Zealand Show," have recently finished recording a television show, "Take Ten." This Country and Western Programme is due for release in the local stations in the middle of July. The producers were so delighted with this venture, that all the artists have been engaged for a further two productions.

The idea of having the stage and cast in a round-the-chuck-wagon setting was formulated last year, and was found to be a great success with the audiences. It gave a more relaxed and intimate atmosphere between artists and audiences, and the artist did not have to move on and off the stage.






