After the AGM will be the home brew competition so bring along anything you have constructed ove rthe last 12 months. If you cant bring it through the door take a photo as evidence.

The club dinner is this Friday at the National Servioce Club, on Market St opposite the Warehouse. Please advise Bill Lowes if you are coming. I look forward to seeing you there.

The weekend of the 5th and 6th of December is VHF UHF field day weekend. This year I am doing something different. Myself and Charlotte will be at Panekiri, near lake Waikaraemoana. At 1130m high it will have a good lookout around this corner of the north island, as well as into Waikato and Auckland. It is a decent walk so to make it worth while I need plenty of contacts. We will be operational on 3 bands and all will be QRP.

The contest hours are from 1700 - 2300 on Saturday evening, and 0700 - 1300 on Sunday morning I would like one contact per band per hour from as many hams as possible. For the first contact please supply your location, and if you are QRP (5 Watts output or less). Unlike our expeditions up Taraponui I will not have a radio on each band so you may have to find where I am listening - be patient - I do want to work you. Handheld radios will probably not make it to Panekiri so you will probably need to operate from a good mibile or a home station. It will be interesting to see what the coverage is like from up there. I may have a handheld on 725 but it may get turned off during the contest.

We plan on driving up Friday evening and walking up Saturday morning. I hope to put the square on the counties net on 3677 Friday evening. We look forward to plenty of contacts up there to make it a worthwile exercise. Please take the time to callin.

Kaweka Challenge. I believe Rob ZL2SG is looking for a couple of operators for this event. Please contact him direct if you are able to assist. The car rally will probably be late April so it wont be long and I will be looking for ops for this event also.

The new IRLP node is up and running and has been connected to NASA node 9877 for the past week, with space shuttle comms, and has made good listening. Tune in on 432.700MHz, with a 123.0Hz CTCSS if you wish.

Does anyone want to use APRS? So far in Hawkes Bay I seem to be the only mobile station on APRS. If you would like to set up a tracker in your vehicle let me know and I can point you in the right direction. On that note, have a good christmas, and a happy new year, and we will hear you all on the air. Dont forget to say hello to tourists on the local repeaters, we all know how fustrating it is to call on other repeaters in vain.

NAPIER NEWS...

The next meeting is the AGM and Pan Pac trophy at the clubrooms on Wednesday December 2 at 7.30 pm. These were postponed last month because of lack of numbers as a number of people were out of town. Remember to bring along something that you have constructed for the Pan Pac trophy contest.

The kitset evenings have come to an end. Most of the antenna analyser kits have been completed and are working satisfactorily while the few remaining are being finished off at home by the individuals. Thanks to all of those who assisted others- Peter, Gary, Lee and Laurie. The project which was suggested by Michael ZL2FAR was very successful.

Changing or adding callsigns seems to be in fashion. Two that I have come across recently are Michael ZL2FAR who is also known as ZL2MY and Rob ZL2RFL known in some circles as ZL2US.

An interesting DXpedition is on air from Chesterfield Island (actually a reef) at present as TX3A. Chesterfield is part of the New Caledonia group of islands but qualifies for a DXCC entity as it is 550 km from the mainland. Two ops – a Hungarian and an American have been there from early November till the 30th or early December. They are doing mainly CW with increasing amounts of SSB and RTTY on all bands with mostly one rig but at times 2 rigs. Through the night from early evening one does two and a half hour stints on air each while the other sleeps and so on till dawn. Through the day one operates while the other does emails, uploads logs, snorkels etc – they are living on fish!. They seem to sleep on the yacht which they swim out to and they operate from a tent on the beach with antennae over the water. The incoming tide detunes some of the antennae. It's an excellent DXpedition and they are doing extremely well running 24 hours per day on generators which they have repaired themselves. The cluster comments are very complimentary unlike for several recent DXpeditions which copped a lot of flack. Sunspot increases are helping their tallies with better band conditions. The CQ Worldwide CW contest is on the weekend of 28/29 November and ZM2M or alternative callsign ZM4T will be active from Tangoio with a small team. ZM2M did very well as a multi-2 entry (two rigs multi operator) in the CQ Worldwide SSB contest over the weekend of 24/25 October. We had 3600 odd contacts for 3.5 million points from QSOs on all 6 bands from 160M to 10M. On 160 we only had a handful of QSOs and not a great number on 80 because of noisy band conditions – continual static. However 15M performed very well and we had two good runs on 10M – one to Japan and the other to North America. Ops were Lee ZL2AL, Stan ZL2ST, Gary ZL2IFB, Holger ZL3IO, Michael ZL2FAR/MY and Mike ZL2CC from Gisborne. Remember the combined Branches Christmas dinner. See details elsewhere in this magazine and book with Bill ZL2UBG.
