Napier Amateur Radio Club News.....

Hi all,

Not much on the bands to report this month, although 10 metres has risen from the dead on a few odd days. Friday 20th saw Lee ZL2AL and me ZL2TC at the clubrooms to drop down the 80/40 metre trap dipole for retuning, as the 80 metre resonance was found to be outside the amateur band. What initially looked like a simple job taking an hour or two didn't turn out like that, as often happens with this sort of job. Fortunately Wally ZL2DO turned up to lend a much needed hand. We found that the outer legs of the antenna were being partly detuned by the foliage where it passed through the gum trees, so we dropped the whole antenna down, chopped a couple of feet of wire off each end to compensate, replaced the feed-line while we had it down, and with the aid of Lee's trusty spud launcher, fired new tieoff lines through a less dense part of each tree, and after temporarily hauling it up to check the SWR, and having a coffee break courtesy of Wally, we declared it fixed.

At the last committee meeting, we firmed up an idea that has been kicking around for a while , and that is the formation of a Hawkes Bay Emergency Net. With Civil Defense moving away from amateur radio, and AREC becoming a stand-alone organization, we felt it would be useful to have an informal net of local amateurs which would be a communications network of last resort, to assist local authorities in the event of a natural disaster. The idea being to have a monthly net on 80 metres and 2 metres and have local amateurs check into the net to indicate that they are available and have an HF rig and antennas in working order. Tentatively this will be on the third Wednesday of each month, 7:30 pm. There will be a net controller, yet to be decided but this is a position that could be rotated around.

As you will read elswhere, The Hawkes Bay Amateur Radio club's battle with the District Council over antenna masts is as yet un-resolved, and it's a reminder that we no longer live in a benign environment where we had some degree of acceptance by the community and local authorities because of our role in CD and SAR. In one or two cases we have had open hostility, bred by lack of understanding, and sensationalist reporting by the news media. Just a reminder, next Napier Club meeting Wednesday 4th March, and make a note in your diary for the Wanganui Junk Sale on 2nd of May.
