# Car Rally and LXpedition with Mike ZL2VM and David ZL2DW at Taraponui HB, 13 - 14/11/15

Having to establish a temporary repeater at Taraponui (4300 ft as, inland from Lake Tutira) for the duration of the recent HB Car Rally, meant that Mike and I travelled to Taraponui on the prior Friday afternoon. Making the repeater go took only a couple of minutes so we continued the day by setting up an 80m dipole between a mast and the microwave tower (in the snow and hail) and set ourselves up for the duration. HF wasn't fantastic in activity but what we did hear was super quiet (the S meter rarely came up to S1) and ZL signals usually S9 or better. I don't think that the altitude, over a conventional low level paddock, contributed any benefit to the HF performance, however we had the time and opportunity to "play" and it was certainly something to do in the evening before we crashed into bed at about 8-45pm.

I do like my job/work but I do wonder if sleeping with commercial repeaters is taking my desire too far hi hi, however the room was nice and warm.

The next day dawned for us at 5-10am with a security company phone call (they thought we would be checking out of the building at 5am and wondered why we hadn't done so) however it also allowed us to step outside to see the most amazing sun rise with the orange glow stretching from behind Cape Kidnappers right across to Mahia Peninsula,......the camera just did not do it justice.....amazing.

After a warm breakfast and a roam around the hill top Mike and I played with his selection of HF wire aerials that he wanted to measure and test, we certainly had the right environment to play in giving near identical surroundings to those that he will encounter during his tramping escapades.

Packing up, cleaning up and a wee afternoon sleep didn't take long and then it was departure time at 6pm......home by just after 8pm.

A great way to start a weekend.
