

Ths month has been a quiet but busy one Ham Radio wise, I have been busy getting the current Club project under way, this is a two part project, first version is a dummy load, rated at 100 watts as a companion to last years SWR bridge, making the combination of the two projects a power meter as well. The second version is a LCD displayed version, that will display power, heatsink temperature and offer an auto ranging bar graph power display, so that tuning and SSB monitoring can take place. The power detection is by a logrithmic detector with a huge dynamic range, allowing detection from a few milliwatts to the rated 100 watts with ease. This is another Arduino based project, so the sketch will be available at the completion. There is a price list (that offers discount to Branch 13 and 25 members) elsewhere in this issue of Break Out. Be in quick as a total of 20 units will be offered, as usual.





Napier Amateur Radio Club 2019 Project:

The project this year is a dummy load, rated at 100 watts intermittent service, this is designed as a load for last years project, the SWR bridge.

As an alternative, an enhanced version of the dummy load is offered, this device has a full display with several readouts, including a bargraph display to facilitate tuning as well as digital readout of power, temperature and operating voltage.

Both units are housed in similar housings as demonstrated and confirmed at last months meeting. A selection of RF connectors is offered and the frequency response of the power meter is extended to the UHF range (500Mhz). Sensitive enough to read a few milliwatts with a top range of 100 watts (intermittent). As members of Branch 25 you are offered a discount and this privilege is extended to our neighbours at Branch 13.

Pricing is as follows:

Basic with UHF connector	\$58.00	\$63.80
Basic with N connector	\$60.00	\$66.00
Display with N connector	\$109.00	\$119.90
Display with UHF connector	\$107.00	\$117.70

What you get:-

All materials for your choice PCB assembled if display mode all other assembly your care

What you don't get:-

any painting or other finishing wire or coax to connect unit

HOW TO STOP A REPEATER LOCK-ON

Over the last three weeks or so '670 repeater has had at least three "lock on's", sometimes for up to an hour at a time. It is suspected that they are not malicious and may be from an unlicensed source. Usually in the background can be heard what is presumed to be audio from a computer, on one occasion it was suspected that porn was being played, perhaps in someone's home workshop.

On Wed. 8 May, late afternoon a '670 lock on was heard again, this time David ZL2OK heard it and observed that he could hear himself being retransmitted.

Soon after he worked out that his 20m signal was entering an HF SDR unit in Utah, USA and the lock on offender was listening to the same SDR via his computer.

David had the presence of mind to make an announcement (via 20m to Utah and then via the SDR unit/computer back to Hastings NZ) and asked the offender listening to stop retransmitting the conversation via his locked on '670 transmitter...... immediately after the '670 lock on stopped.

At this point I advised the offender, via '670, that this was not the first time this had occurred and for them to be more careful in the future (and gave my call sign)...... so fingers crossed that it won't happen again.

Just prior to David's announcement two of us were about to go and DF the source as we had a defined bearing to start with so so further DF ing wouldn't have been hard.

Anyway top marks David for your presence of mind to know and work out what was going on and to make your announcement all the way via USA to someone on our door step.
