I welcome the opportunity to convey my congratulations to the publishers of this new visual photo-magazine a vital news medium which has been lacking in this area for some years now.


Since the old 'Photo News' ceased publication, I have always considered that there has been an opening for a pictorial type news magazine about Hawke's Bay.







HAVELOCK NORTH HIGH SCHOOL'S MUSIC '78






















TOTS TO TEENS SHOW FASHIONS

JOINT VENTURE






