Sir Noel Pierce Coward 1899 - 1973

Playwright, composer, actor, director and wit, Noel Coward was all of these in a career which began when he first appeared on stage in a children's play in 1911

His first play "The Vortex" (in which he not only wrote, but also starred in and directed - a trend he pursued with most of his plays) first appeared on stage in London in 1924

Although most of Coward's 30 or so plays are noted for their biting satire and sophisticated wit, they also proved him capable of moving and tender sentiment

Many of his more renown plays including "Private Lives", "Fallen Angels", "Hay Fever" and "Blithe Spirit" have been performed on stages around the world (including Napier Repertory) some adapting successfully to the silver screen

His songs were noted for their melodies and clever lyrics. Among the most popular are "I'll See You Again', "Some Day I'll Find You", "Mad Dogs and Englishmen" and "Mrs Worthington"
