WOMEN - 1970 AWARD FOR - "WOMAN OF POTENTIAL"

We have been asked to publicise details of the Award - "Woman of Potential". This Award applies to women of all ages, irrespective of race, creed etc., and the Award must have a definite policy to qualify for the Award. The Women's Club of Havelock Bay Area (Inc.) is a member of an International Service Organization comprising 700 clubs in 48 countries - a service club for business and professional women and the N.S. Club this year offers an Award of \$250 (This includes a fully defined) to assist a woman in developing her talents. The level of attainment, field of study and/or business is not restricted but candidates must be resident in Havelock Bay at the time of application. This application must include details of the proposed course of training, re-training, study, for which the award would be used. Examples could be - course at Massey for a pre-school education - for research purposes perhaps involving travelling - technical correspondence course up to \$250 - perhaps community work necessitating training - etc. etc. Candidates may apply personally or be nominated by an employer or person and will be considered by an independent panel of judges. The winner of the Women's Club of Havelock Bay "Woman of Potential Award" will be announced at a public function at the Century Theatre on 31 May, when the Award will be presented in person. The Award must be taken up within a year of its being presented. Applications close on 31 March, 1970, and must be accompanied by a \$5 entry fee. In a community such as the Fruit Belt of N.Z., our Fruit Industry surely deserves to be pushed into the promotion field such as a Country Fair.
