WHAT IT DOES

200,000 children pass through 'Save The Children Fund' medical and welfare clinics each day around the world. 1,100 doctors, nurses and welfare workers are on duty 24 hours each day. Homes, schools and hospitals are provided for poor, blind, crippled and intellectually handicapped children in countries where there are **no** widows pensions **no** invalid pensions **no** child allowance and **no** social security.

This Cantata, consisting of Vachell Lindsay's Poem set to music by Herbert Chappel, was especially written for 10-13 year old children.
