MISS BETTY CARNACHAN

Miss Betty Carnachan received all her National Dancing tuition from Miss Muriel Waugh, a life member of the Academy of Piping and National Dancing. She is Principal of a large school of Dancing in Christchurch, and has judged major Competition Festivals throughout New Zealand. As a member of both the Technical Committee and Executive Council of New Zealand Piping and National Dancing she has examined on their behalf in the North Island for the past two years. Miss Carnachan is also a member of the Royal Academy of Dancing, London.

RULES FOR PIPING AND DANCING.

- 1—All Piping and Dancing Competitions will be run under the Rules laid down by the Piping and Dancing Association of New Zealand (Inc.)
- 2—Championships in Dancing and Piping, also Irish Hornpipe, will not count in Points Prizes.
- 3—In the event of a tie for any Points Trophy it will be decided as laid down by the Rules of the Piping and Dancing Association of N.Z.
- 4—Points for trophies will count: First 5 points; Second 3 points; Third, 1 point.
- 5—All Competitors in Piping and Dancing MUST be registered and MUST produce Registration Cards before competing.
- 6—A Novice is a competitor who has never won a first prize in any Highland competition.
- 7—"B" Grade in Piping open to pipers who have not won an open "A" Grade Competition held under the Rules of the New Zealand Piping and Dancing Association.
- 8—Conversation with the judges by competitors or interested persons STRICTLY PROHIBITED. Breach of this Rule will lead to DISQUALIFICATION.
- 9—Age Limit to be computed at date of entry. All competitors must be prepared to produce birth certificate.
- 10—The judge's decision in all competition matters will be final and the Committee reserves the right to delete any class for which there is not sufficient entries, or alter or adjust any prize money if necessary.
- 11—NO Certificate for any Provincial or North Island Championship shall be issued unless there are three or more bona fide competitors in the event.
- 12—The Stewards supervising the Dancing and Piping Competitions may request the judge not to consider any competitors whose Parent or Guardian or other directly interested person, acts in any abusive or offensive manner to any Official or Competitor during the gathering, and the Judge shall comply.

- 14—No taps or loose plates to be worn in Irish Jigs or Irish Reels.

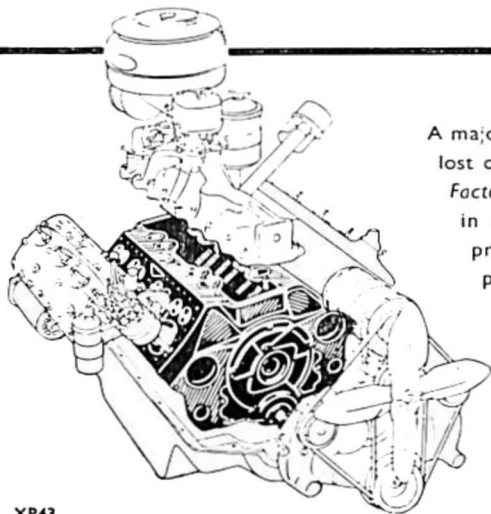
