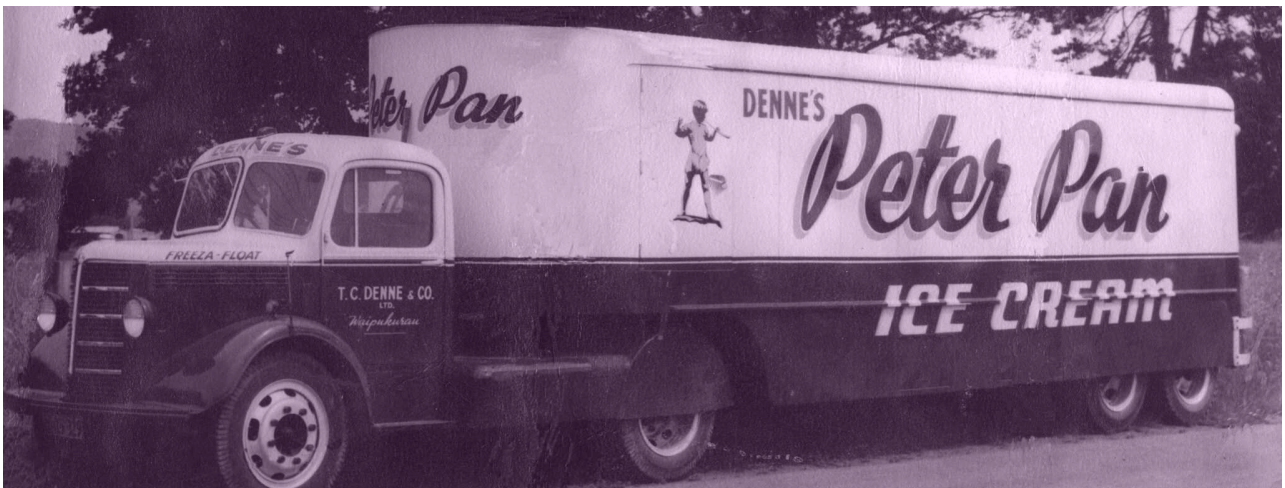

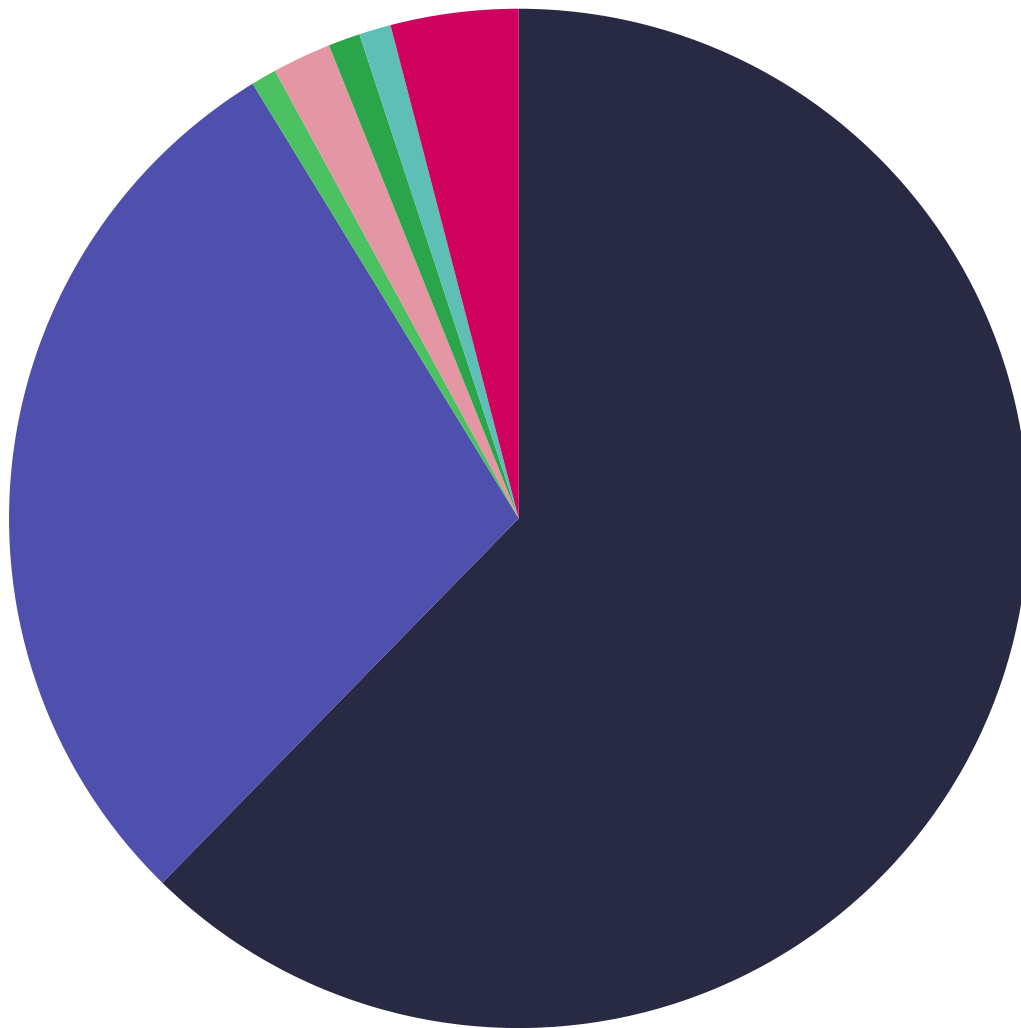

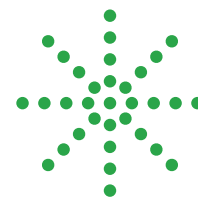

The year in review



2023 was about spreading our wings and raising the profile of Knowledge Bank in the community.

Cyclone Gabrielle reinforced the need for our services. Knowledge Bank were fortunate enough to preserve 255 collections for families and organisations within the community.

A highlight of the year was being able to replace precious photos and collections which were lost in the cyclone.

We have successfully fostered new relationships with Taradale Senior Citizens Association, Central Hawke's Bay Libraries, Radio Hawke's Bay, Wairoa Star Newspaper, Wairoa Museum, Onga Onga Historical Society, EIT and EIT Screen Production.

We look forward to working with them in 2024.

Hastings 150th commemoration



Knowledge Bank was proud to be part of Hastings 150th commemoration celebrations, participating in several events throughout the year.

Hosting our first Gala Day in November in conjunction with Hastings District Council was a highlight of the celebration.

Over 2,000 people attended the Gala Day, giving major exposure to Knowledge Bank, Stoneycroft homestead, and Applecroft subdivision

EIT/EIT Screen Production

In the first part of the year Knowledge Bank was home to CAD (Architecture) students from EIT who were impacted by Cyclone Gabrielle. They quickly became part of our Knowledge Bank family.

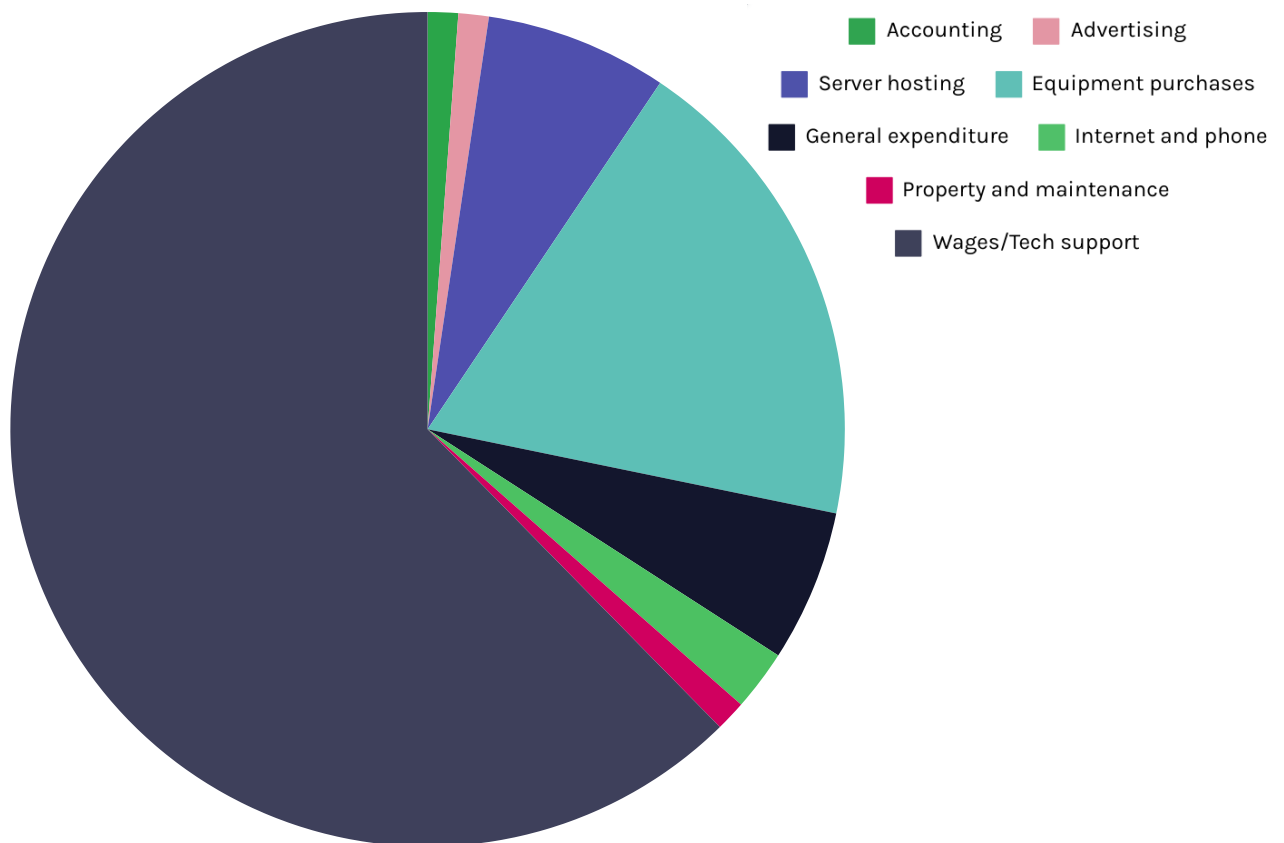

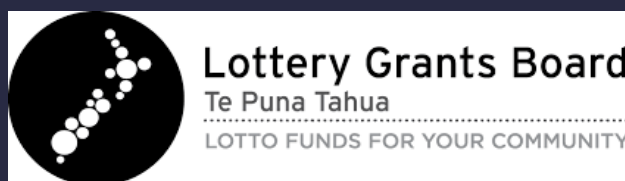
