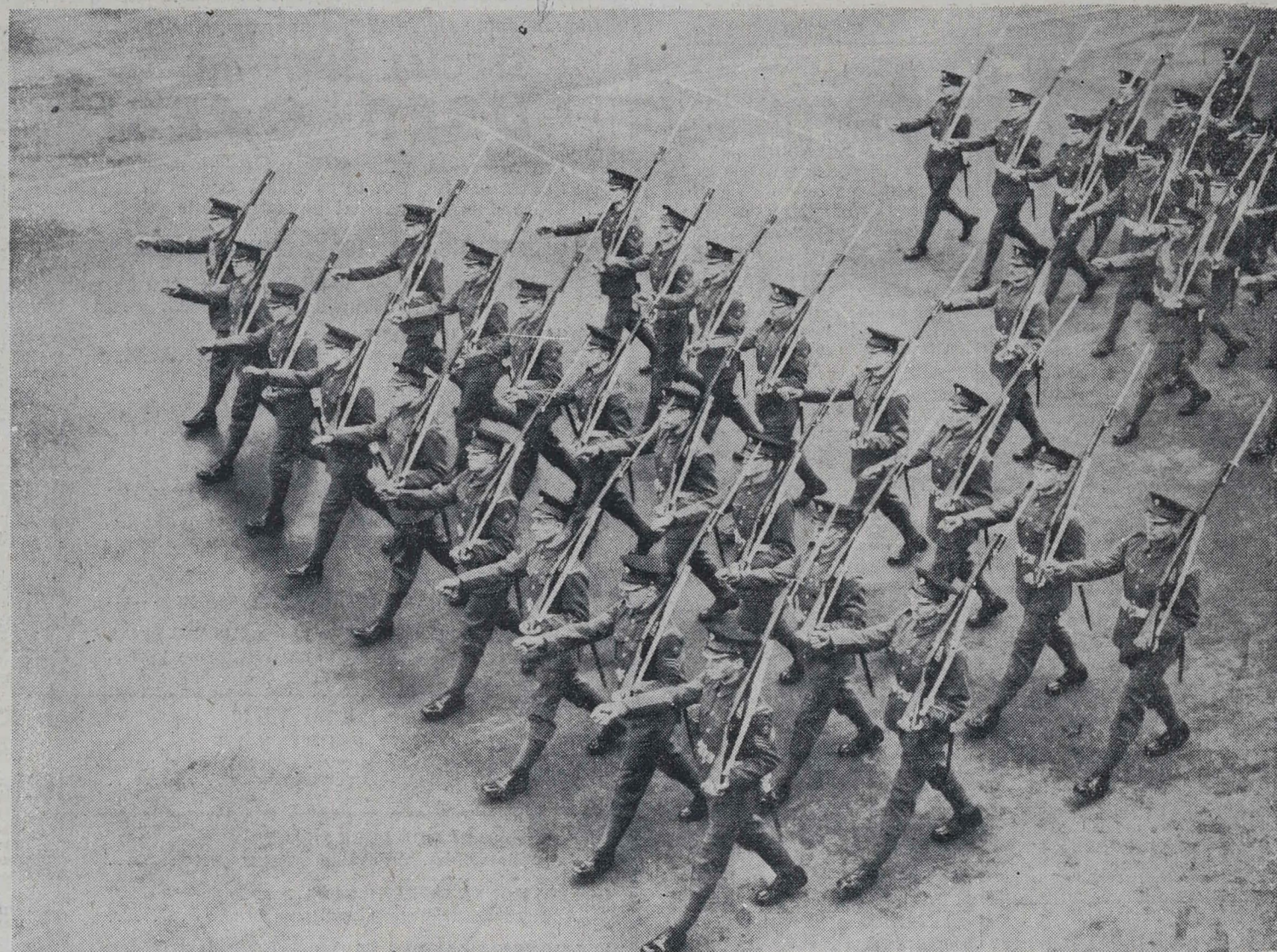








MAN IN THE IRON MASK.—An electric welder bends to his task on the new oil tanks being constructed at Port Ahuriri.



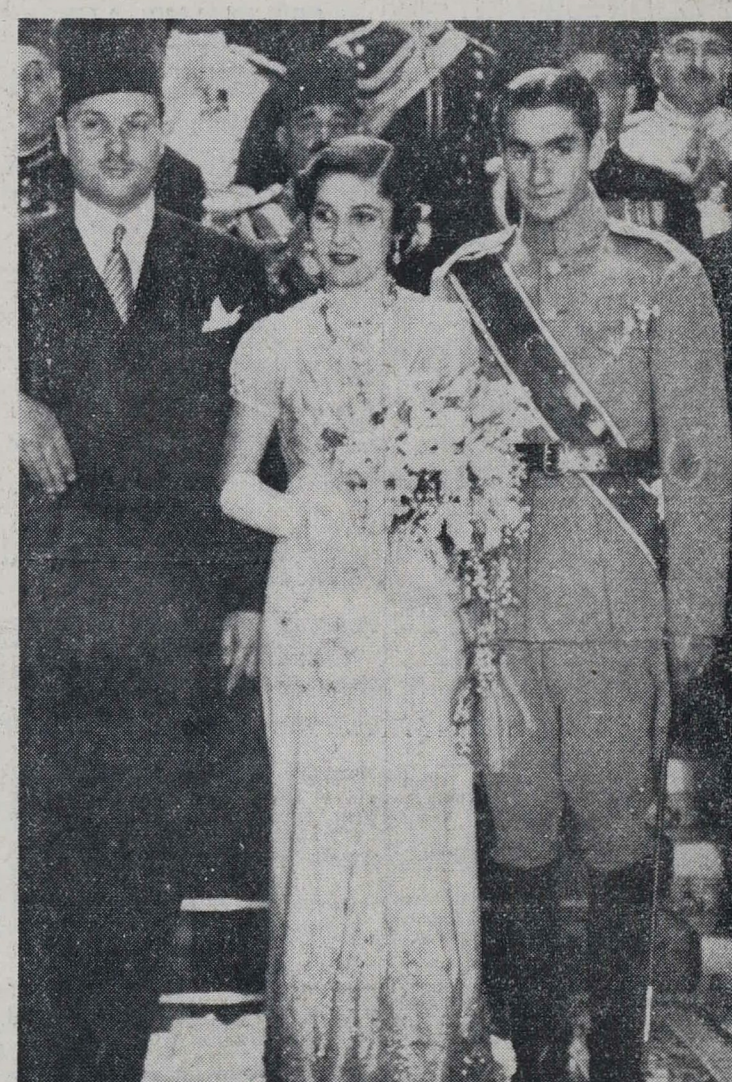

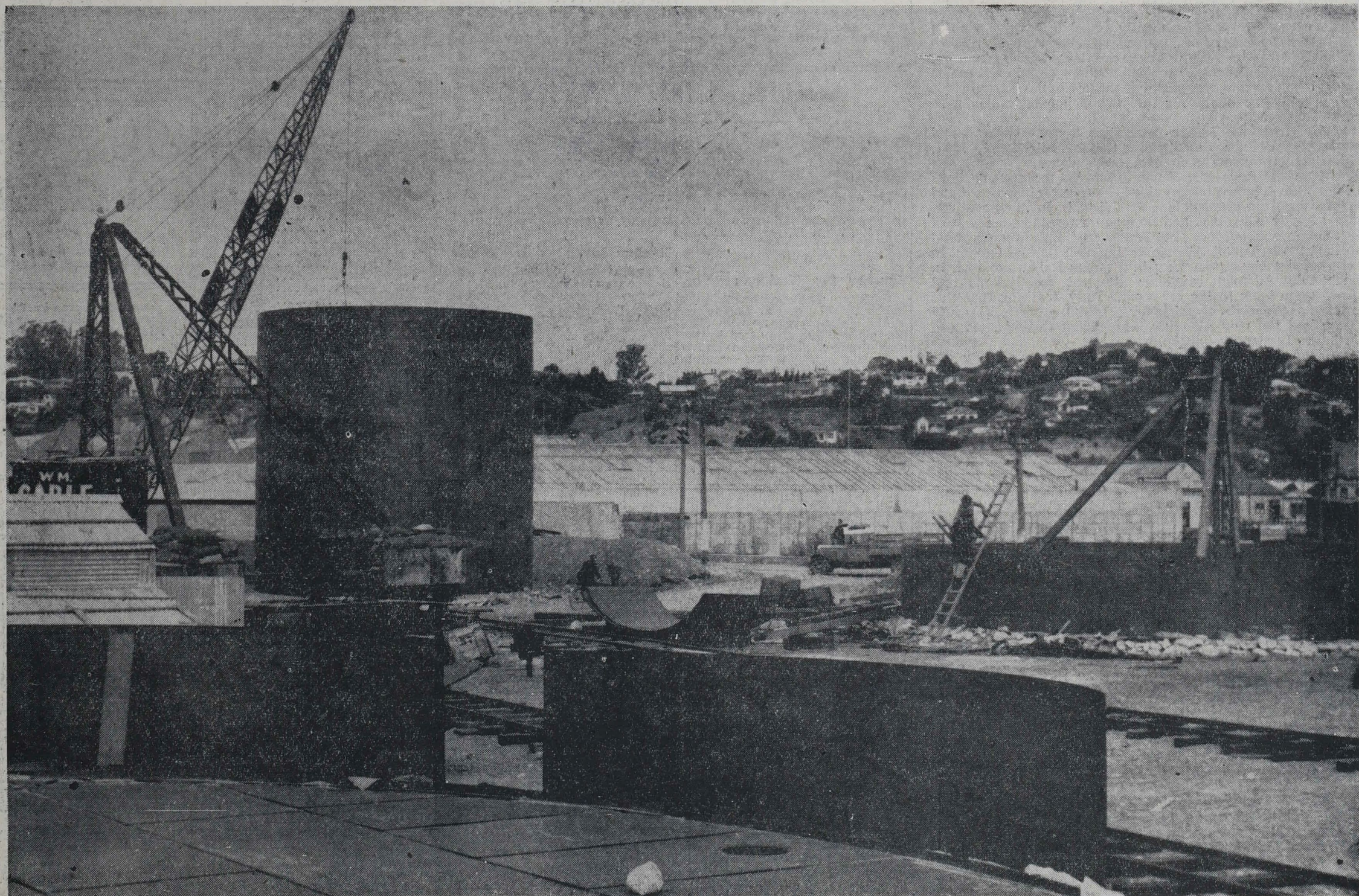



The reports of Italian moves to adopt Albania under a "protectorate" (after the Hitler fashion) must be puzzling to many people.

At length the Italian occupation became general, and eventually Albania passed under Italian protection in 1917, though still retaining its nominal independence.

After the war, Yugo-Slavia attempted to annex portions of northern Albania, but an allied commission intervened and a provisional government was established.

Yugo-Slavia, then again endeavoured to carve a slice out of the northern Albania, and in 1921 Britain was forced to intervene in order to smooth over the extreme tension which was created.

Since then Italy has been fairly active in Albania. Italian financial interests were virtually placed in control of the country, and many concessions were granted.

The last stage of the championship will be completed when the "chillers" are judged at Smithfield.

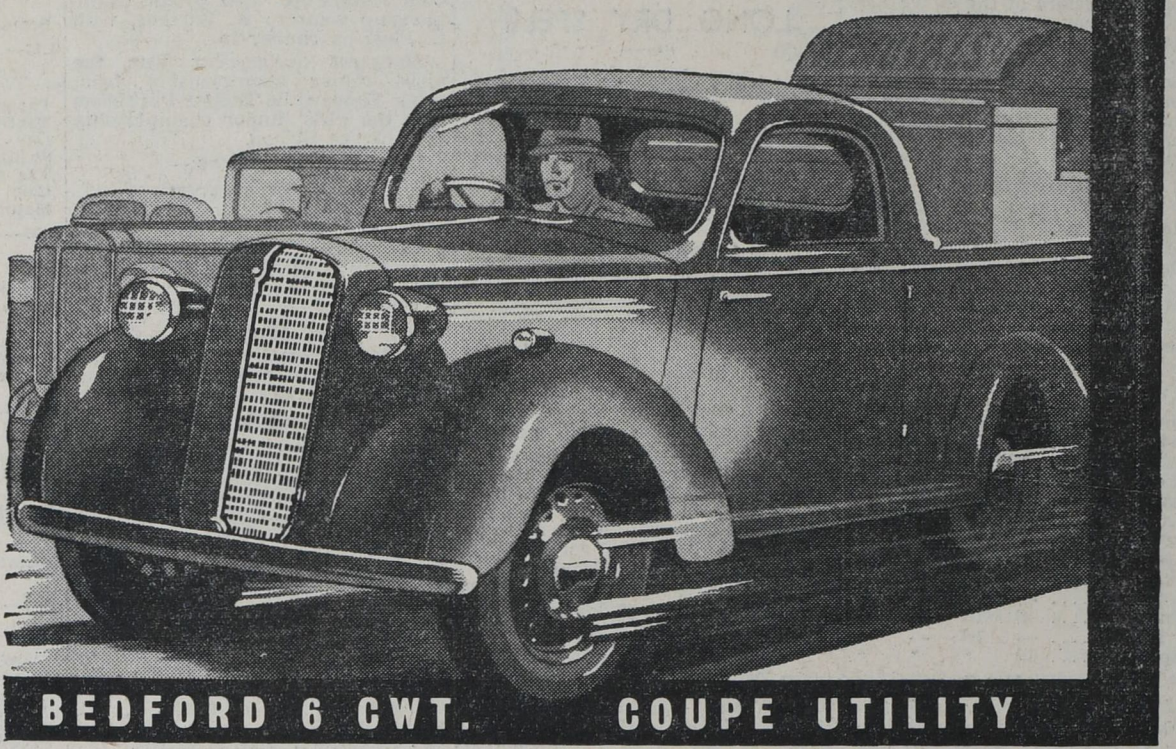

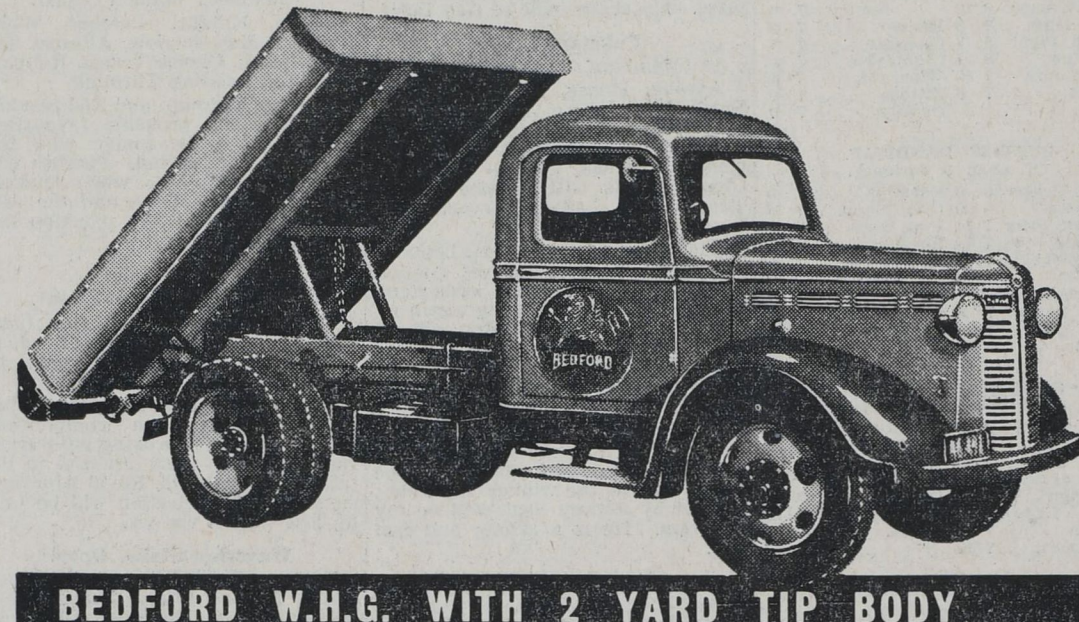

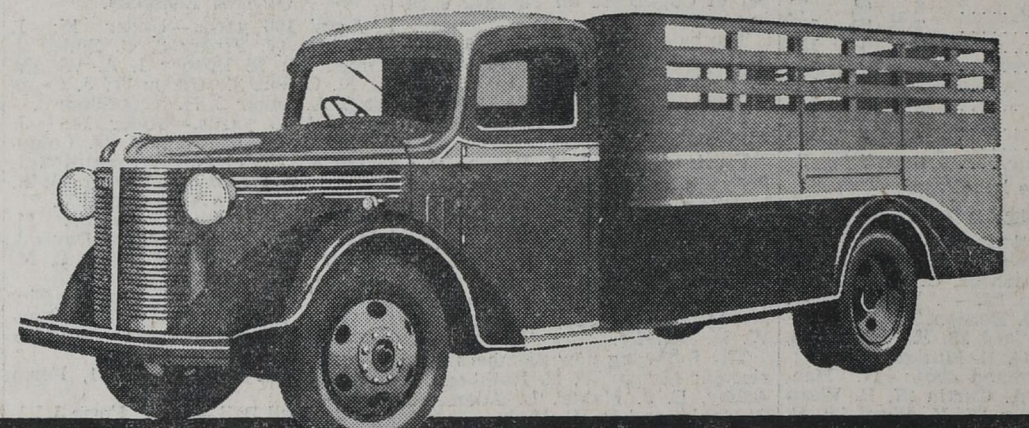

### INDIAN OCEAN FLIGHT

#### FROM AUSTRALIA TO AFRICA

#### IMPORTANT TASK

The Prime Minister of Australia (the Rt. Hon. J. A. Lyons) recently emphasised the importance of the air survey flight to be made in June across the Indian Ocean in the flying boat Guba. The survey, he said, was intended to open up possibilities of more direct air communication between Australia and Africa, thus tending to increase the already close co-operation between the two Dominions.

"It is felt that, as regards Empire communications and in the general scheme of Empire defence, this undertaking by an Australian expedition will be a valuable contribution," said Mr Lyons.

The Government had been fortunate in securing Captain P. G. Taylor to take charge of the flight.

### Exploration By Flying-Boat

#### WORK IN NEW GUINEA

#### A Millionaire's Experiences

#### UNKNOWN COUNTRY

"Daily Mail" Special Service.  
SYDNEY, March 20.

The expedition, organised by Mr. R. Archbold, an American millionaire-naturalist, has been collecting the specimens in Dutch New Guinea. It would have been impossible other than by flying boat, which landed on lakes in depressions of 11,000ft. mountains, or on lakes, in the valleys, and flew over impassable jungle. Stores, supplies and scientific apparatus, with camp material, valued at £500,000 had been flown to the camps. One hundred Dyak carriers were the labour corps. The expedition numbered nine white men.

Many of the specimens obtained were believed to be unknown to natural history investigators, and it was said that white men had never before penetrated to the country where the expedition operated, nearly 200 miles from the coast.

Supplies were dropped by parachute when the parties moved out from the camps. Requirements were communicated by radio to the base camp.

Twenty-two large cases of specimens of New Guinea birds and mammals had been shipped from New Guinea to the America Museum of Natural History by the Archbold expedition, and 10 more were to be sent, said Commander L. A. Yancey on March 7, on arrival from New Guinea.

Corrosion of an eight-inch cast-iron main carrying hot water from Whakarewarewa to the Ward and Blue Baths in the Government Gardens at Rotorua was responsible for a "blow out." A gang of men sent to effect repairs found it necessary to remove about two chains of the pipe where it passed through a bed of sulphur. So badly corroded were the old pipes that in places the walls were barely thick enough to withstand the pressure of the water.
