Duelling Days Recalled PAIR OF PISTOLS Lent To Hawke's Bay Museum NAPOLEONIC MEDALS

A fine pair of flintlock muzzle-loading French duelling pistols, probably 150 years old, and nine bronze medallions celebrating notable events during the French Revolution and the career of Napoleon Bonaparte have been lent to the Hawke's Bay Museum by Mr N. Alder, of Napier. They have been placed on display in the museum. The pistols are beautifully preserved, and the barrels and other parts of the metalwork are decorated with gold inlay. Other portions are beautifully chased and the carved decoration of the butts is also interesting. A gold engraving shows that the pistols were manufactured by Le Page, who is described as arms maker to the king. Two of the medals deal with outstanding events during the Revolution - the siege of the Bastille on July 14, 1789, and the king's arrival in Paris on October 6, of the same year. One medal commemorates the appointment of Napoleon as First Consul in 1799, and another the Battle of Marengo in 1800. A tiny, exquisitely modelled view of the battle in bas relief is shown on the face of this medal. Three of the larger medallions show Napoleon as Emperor in 1804, and another dated 1810, bears his head and that of the Empress Marie Louise. One of the smaller medallions dated 1800 shows Napoleon at the pass of St. Bernard. 'Andrieu,' the name of the engraver, is shown on the edge of the medallions.

Food Control Measures

WAR PRECAUTIONS

Plans for war-time control of Great Britain's food were disclosed recently by Sir Henry French, Director of the Food Defence Plans Department. The main points are:
 All food supplies to be under a Food Controller, to be assisted by directors of supplies.
 Meat and other important foods to be rationed.
 The aim is to prevent any food shortage and to secure regulated prices and no queues.

There would be no opportunities for speculation.

If necessary, stocks will be requisitioned and distribution controlled by the central authority.

The census of available foodstuffs is now almost complete. Special preparations are being made to protect transport from the menace of air attack by widespread dispersal of stocks.

The change from normal trading to war-time control would be operated as far as practicable by food-traders themselves.

The public would be supplied with ration-books for meat, sugar, butter and other goods.
 There would be control of supplies at source and mobilisation of importers, manufacturers and wholesale distributors as Government agents.

A single controlling authority would be responsible for the supply of foodstuffs and animal feeding stuffs for the fighting services.

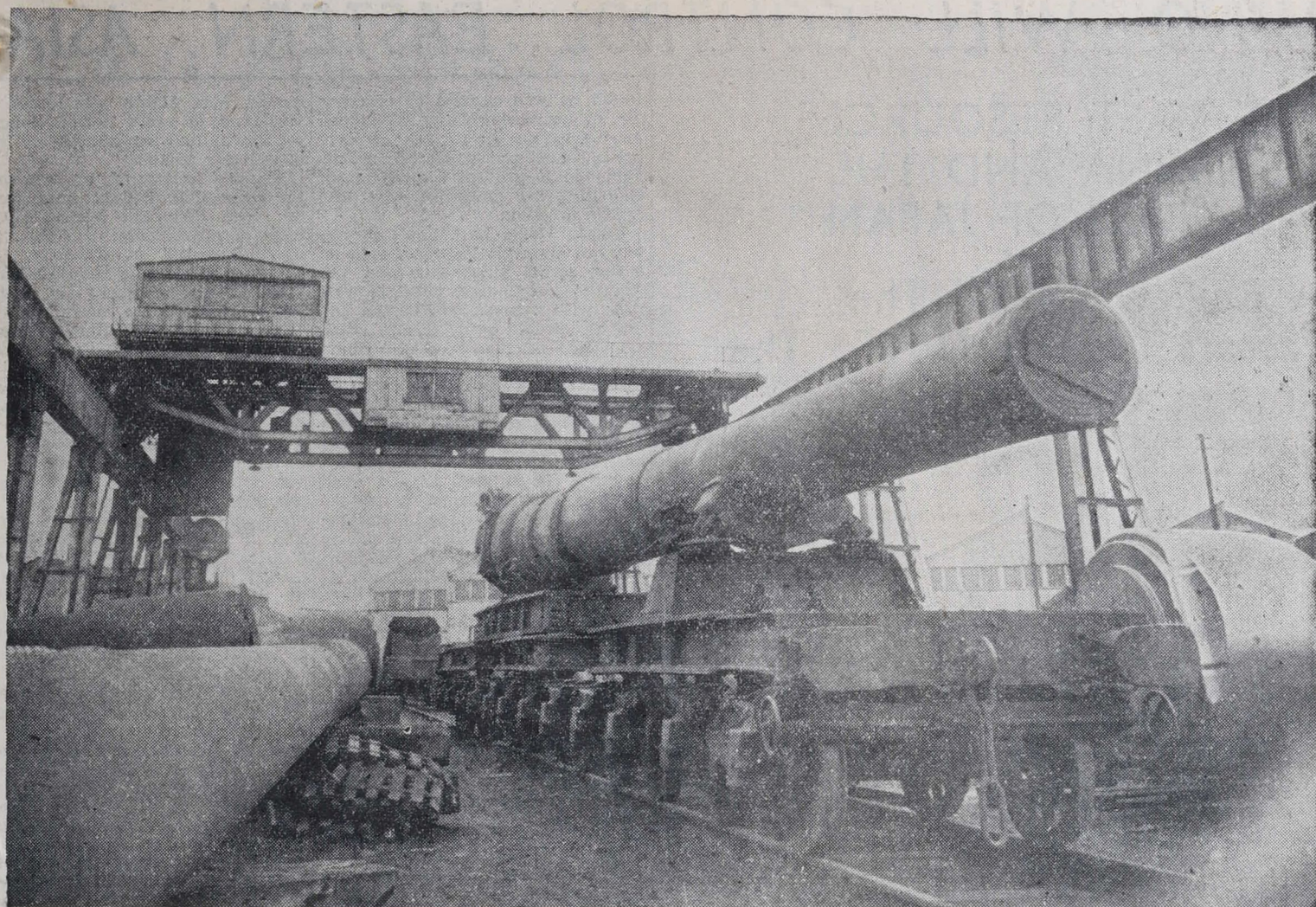

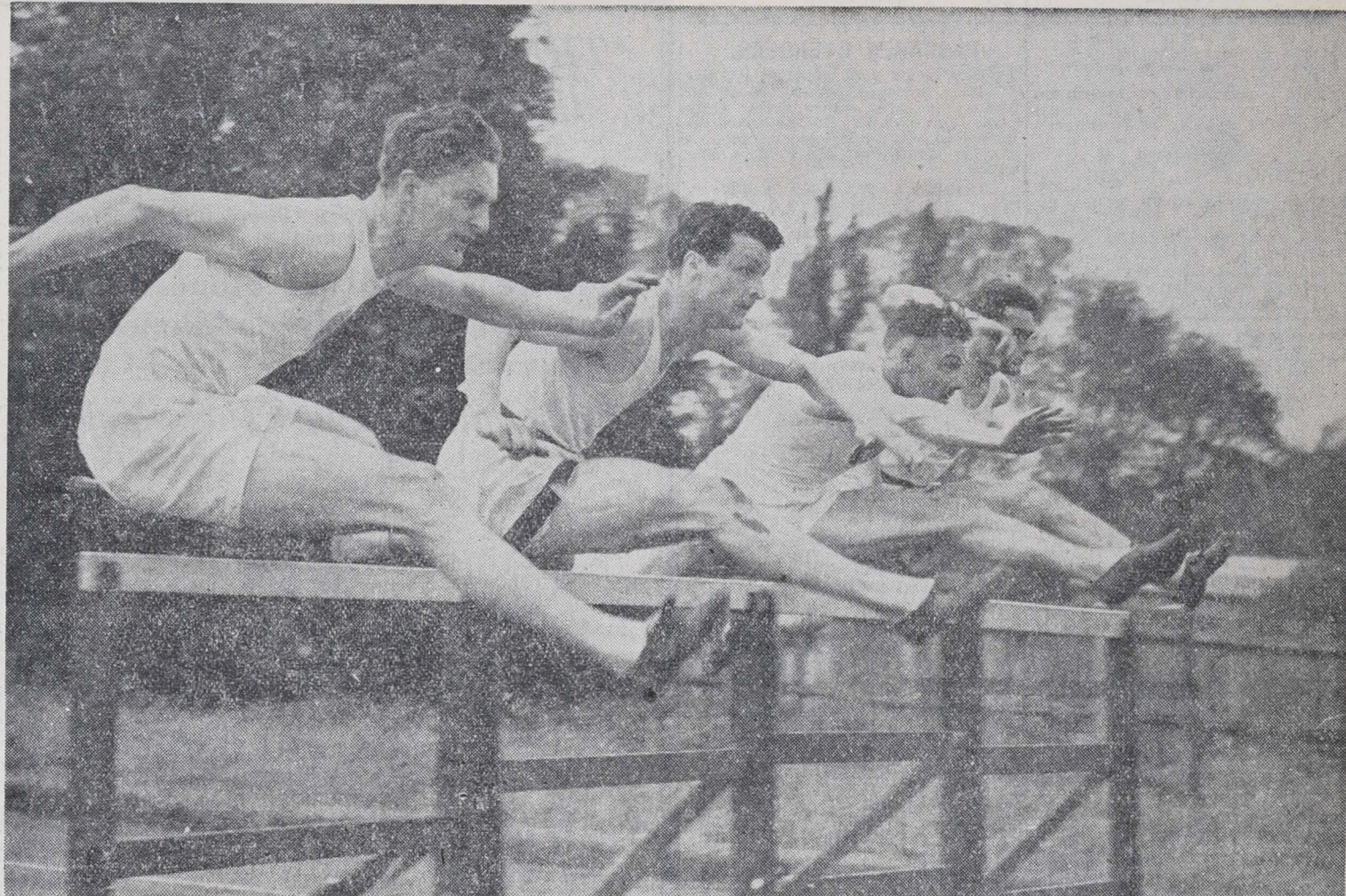

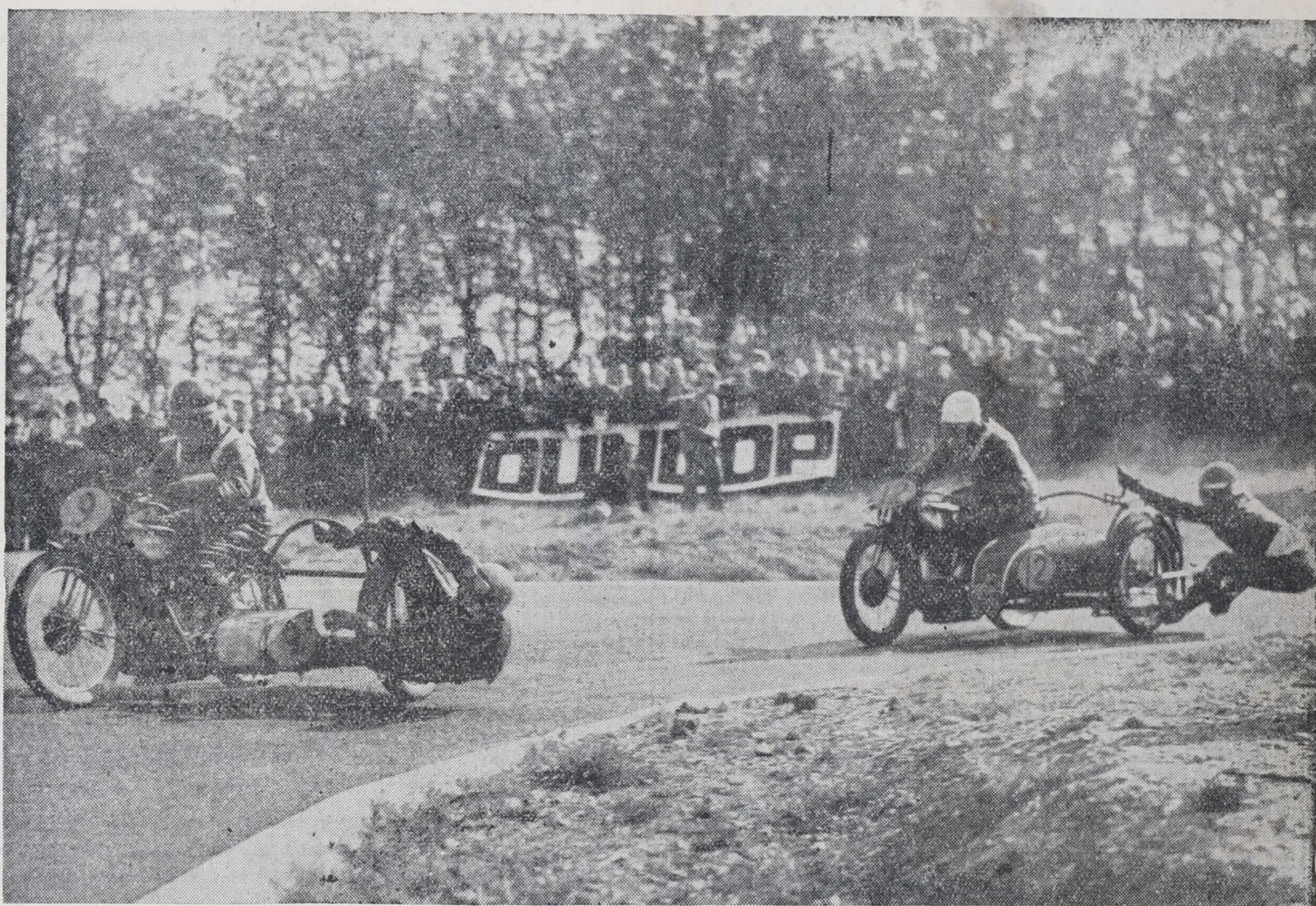

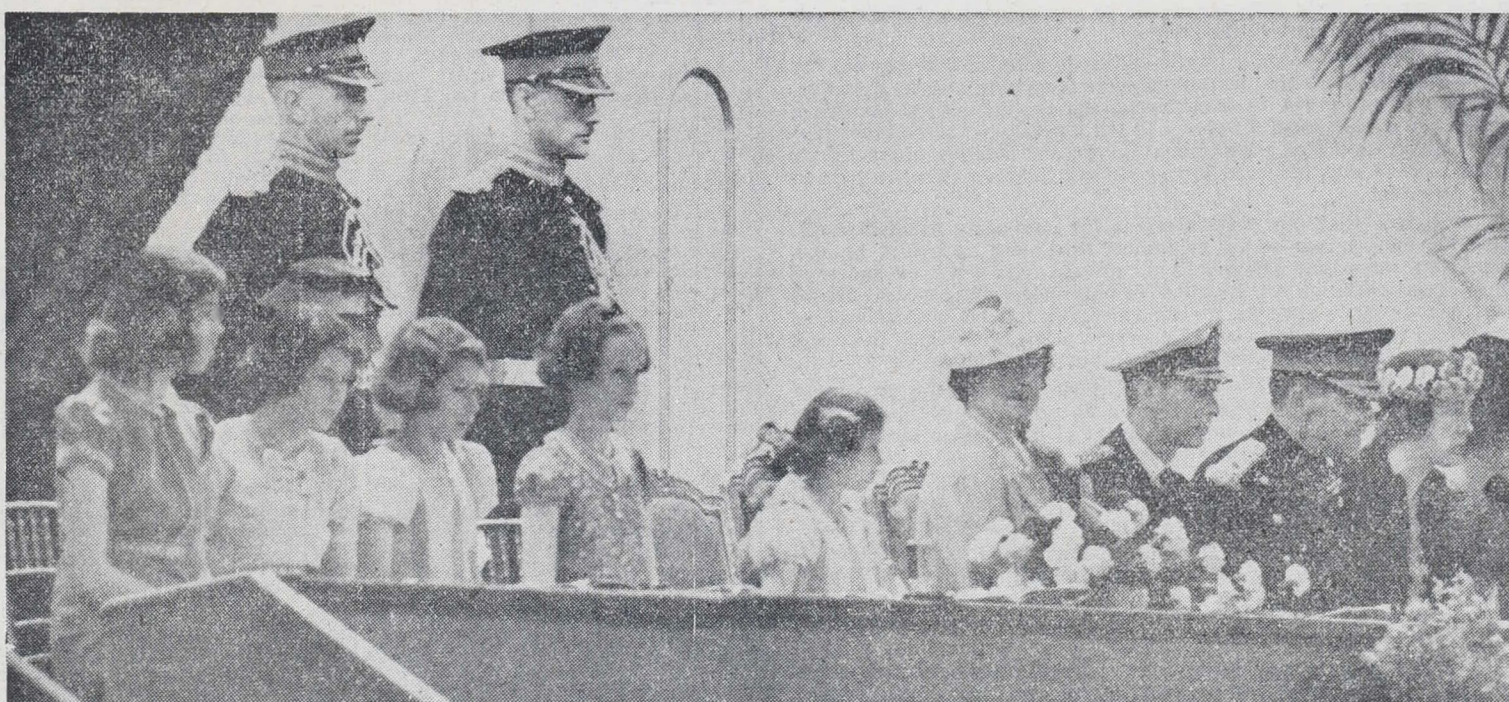

CARNIVAL IN HASTINGS HOLDS SWAY

BUSY SCENES: VARIED ATTRACTIONS DRAW LARGE CROWDS

Carnival held sway in Hastings yesterday afternoon for the second day of the town's shopping campaign.

The motor procession of about 50 vehicles ranging from the latest cars to old models provided an added carnival note. Of the crowds of shoppers and sightseers which assembled along Heretaunga Street to see the procession groups of children showed most animation at the distribution of balloons from the cars.

At the conclusion of the procession many of the late model cars taking part were parked in Russell Street for public inspection.

The window displays for the carnival period are particularly attractive and the strings of coloured lamps across Heretaunga Street do much to brighten the business area.

Retailers interviewed by the "Daily Mail" reported exceptionally good business, particularly during the afternoon. "The carnival has certainly been largely responsible for livening up trade in the town," said one man.

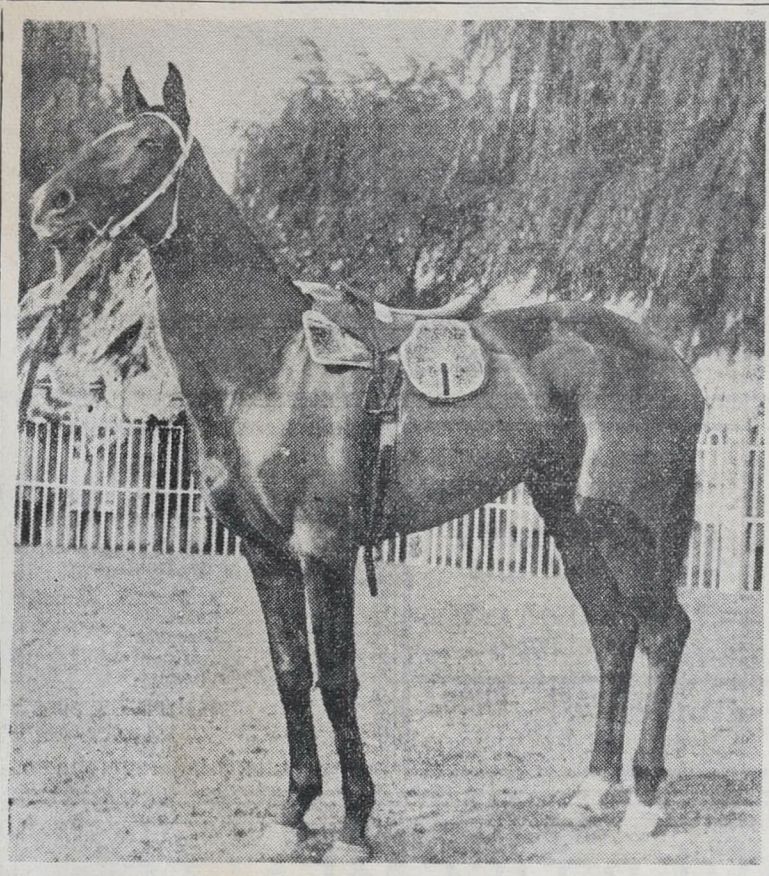
