A Season of New Accessories

Metal is Now a Modern Note

To have a new suit and a new hat does not necessarily mean that you have a new outfit, for no new ensemble is complete without the new accessories. Last year's auxiliaries can, in fact, date a new dress.

Take belts. A short while ago they had to be broad. Now, if you wear one, it must be narrow. This being a "metal" season, belts are most fashionable made of gold or chromium composition, while leather belts must have metal fasteners. Chain effects are very popular at the moment.

The chain belt is just a single line of links, about a quarter of an inch wide. Usually it is trimmed with narrow leather ends to match the colour of the dress, and fastens with a small leather buckle in the centre front.

Handbags The chain motif is repeated on the new handbags. A novelty displayed recently was three bags of different sizes hanging by little chains on to a big chain which could be looped over the arm or carried on the hand.

to retain their professional careers," added Mrs Perren. "In Vienna there have been women doctors, scientists, mathematicians, professors and lawyers for some years. The Austrian women have always been free and typify their country's romance and love of gaiety."

Mrs Perren said that in many directions, however, Nazi Germany had done much that was good. Shortly after the annexation of Austria 400 children of poor families were taken to Germany for a holiday. As in the case of all dictatorships, however, the good that was done was often outweighed by the extremes to which they carried their plans.

"The growth of dictatorships and ideologies seems to go hand in hand with the suppression of women," commented Mrs Perren. "It seems that very soon the only countries where women may retain their individuality will be in the British Empire, the United States and the more isolated countries such as Holland, Switzerland, Norway and Sweden."

FIRST PICTURES BY AIR MAIL OF THE FIRST TEST CRICKET MATCH BETWEEN ENGLAND AND AUSTRALIA PLAYED AT NOTTINGHAM IN THE SECOND WEEK IN JUNE.—England, batting first, made 658 for eight wickets declared. Australia made 411 in the first innings and, following on, played a draw with 427 for six wickets. During the match the English batsmen broke four records and Bradman eclipsed J. B. Hobbs's record for the greatest number of centuries made in Test cricket. ### "SHAPE OF HUMAN FACE IS ALTERING"

#### Narrowing Features: Dean of Dental Faculty Makes Observations

"Are standards of beauty altering?" asked Dr. Bevan Dodds, Dean of the Dental Faculty in the University of Otago, when he commented recently on the change towards the vertical in the shape of the human face. He was convinced that the general proportions of the human face were altering.

There hangs in Dr. Dodds's study at the school an original eighteenth century engraving, in which the persons portrayed have wide, heavy jaws, and broad noses, with the associated bones also more prominent than in the twentieth century man. An old oil painting in the school's library also shows a heavier and wider type of face.

"The modern man has a tendency in features towards the vertical and his jaws and nose are narrower," said Dr. Dodds. "That may be the result of natural selection, a lack of function, or a combination of various factors—probably the last. It is seldom indeed that one sees a jaw in which there is room for the eruption of the lower wisdom tooth, if the individual has not lost his or her teeth earlier. If a young person retains all his teeth, the wisdom tooth is not able to erupt normally, there being no room through fore-shortening, and that condition calls for an operation of varying severity."

### "Crime Wave" In Argyll East Dancing Hall

Mock Court Horrified At Numbers of "Grave Offences"

Heavy Fines

The mock court held in connection with the flood relief dance at Argyll East proved great fun and the fines inflicted augmented the funds not a little.

The court had no hesitation in expressing its horror at the wave of crime sweeping over the district. In fact a guilty complex seemed to permeate the hall, and a friendly touch could easily stimulate violent activity, i.e., a readiness to resist "arrest."

An offence against the Native Bush Act was one of the charges. The "prisoner" was alleged to have removed certain "facial fungus and succulent growth" before it reached the mature stage.

Another popular resident who appeared in abbreviated trousers in his front garden, had to face scathing comment from the Bench for his alleged leanings towards the Sunbathing Club. The said trousers, "exhibit number one" stood in evidence against him. These obviously belonged to a five year old, but nobody was moved by prisoner's plea of not guilty.

One of the most serious charges was that of "attempted suicide," the blood mark on the neck being offered by the "Crown" as particularly convincing evidence. The prisoner contended that the fact that the razor used was a safety showed the obvious lack of suicidal tendency. In reply to this the court gave vent to stern criticism of a "prisoner" so desperately bent on suicide that he was prepared to carry out the act with a safety razor when other implements were available. It is rumoured that the court remitted part of the fine to enable the accused to purchase a blade razor.

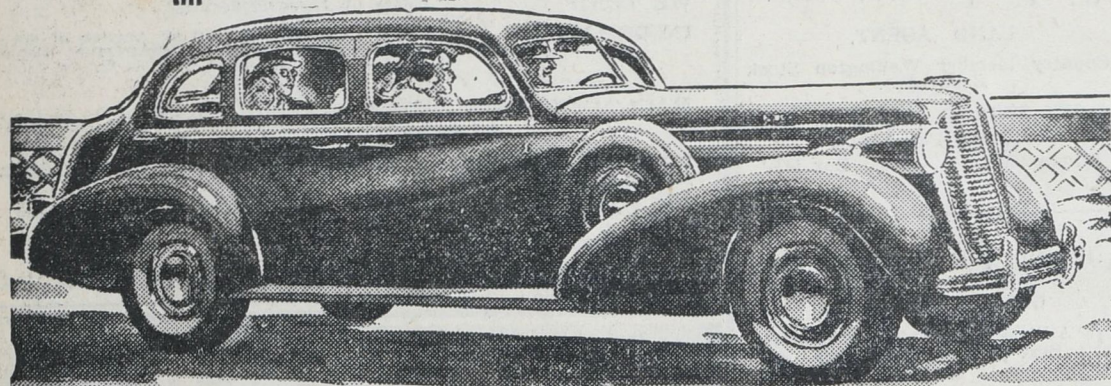
