BOARD'S CHOICE IN RIVER WORKS DISPUTE

Conversion as Public Works Job is Alternative, Says Union Secretary

Apparently only two courses of action are open to the Hawke's Bay River Board in settling the dispute with the workers by the latter union (N. E. Kay). A statement issued by Mr Kay yesterday suggested that, after a consultation with the Minister of Public Works (the Hon. H. Hooper), the union considered that the board would have to hand over the whole scheme to the Public Works Department for completion, or make arrangements on a basis of day wages or cooperative contracts under the provisions of the Labourers' Industrial Agreement and other proposals.

A deputation comprising Messrs H. Kay (Labourer Union), F. Aitchy (Drivers' Federation), and P. O'Brien (Teamsters) is waiting on the Minister of Public Works and the Minister of Labour (the Hon. H. A. Armstrong) at Wellington.

As a result, the following statement was released yesterday by Mr Kay:

"I have had already decided to take over the completion of the scheme as Public Works. It is necessary to say that the board would not be able to do this unless it had the permission of the State, and that, falling this permission being given, an Act of Parliament would be necessary to transfer the Public Works Department under the control of the State.

"The River Board had requested the Minister of Public Works to grant permission for public works being carried out by the board, and the Minister has refused to do so. 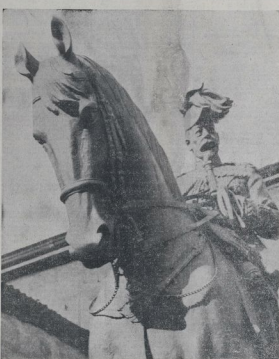

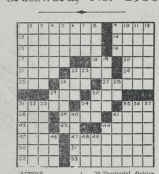

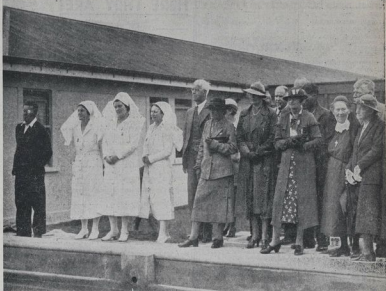
