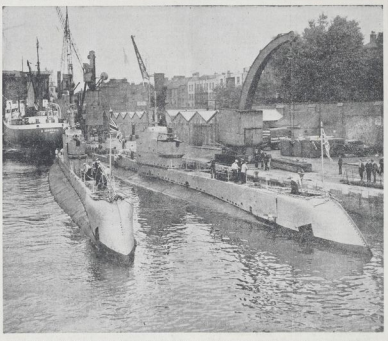

"HITLER WILL MAKE PEACE GESTURE WORLD"

**IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO

The message was brought to the Prime Minister by Lord Brocket, who arrived today by air. Herr Hitler is scheduled to speak at Nuremberg between 7 pm. and 8 pm on Monday, English Summer Time.

 Herr Hitler's speech is awaited in London with certain anxiety, in view of how much is believed to turn upon it, but it is not forgotten that Herr Hitler has repeatedly expressed his desire for peace, and in all responsible quarters here there is every disposition to assume his sincerity.
 A previous message from Nuremberg said that Herr Hitler had been visited by foreign journalists. He appeared to be very happy, laughing and joking. He did not refer to the crisis.
 It is reported to have received 2,000 troops, who goose-stepped past him.

The "Daily Mail" correspondent, Mr. Wlad Pirov, from Nuremberg says that while Herr Hitler will not say or do anything which brings a risk, he has not lost an article of the Russian position, especially in the light of the Soviet, will be an essential feature of any settlement. The foreign press in Nuremberg is so far from being truly strongly declared Germany's determination to see the end of the war, and that Herr Hitler will not likely to lead to the breaking of negotiations.

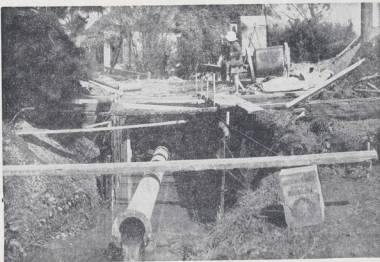

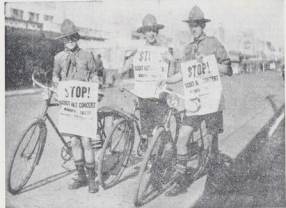

The Manawatu committee of the Young Farmers' Club has announced by the New Zealand Press that a national sheep shearing competition at the Manawatu A. and P. Spring show at Palmerston North on Saturday, November 5.

All class competitors are to receive stipends varying on the occasion of the competition according to the class.

The competition is to be divided into three classes, namely: (1) Class 1. Open to all sheep raisers who can shear better than 120 sheep in one day.
