Will Czechs Join Fascists? ARMY SAID TO HAVE DEMANDED PRESIDENT'S RESIGNATION

Dr. Benes No Longer Leader

LONDON, Oct. 6. Dr. Benes has resigned the Presidency of Czechoslovakia. The Prime Minister (General Svojsky) has been proclaimed President pending the convening of the National Assembly to elect a new President.

It is understood that General Svojsky endeavored to secure Dr. Benes's resignation. Heretofore reported at Nuremberg, he had a personal animosity against Dr. Benes. It is believed that he promised more generous negotiations if the Czech leader would resign.

PLAN FOR SETTLEMENT OF PALESTINE BROUGHT

Political Rights For All Creeds: Transference Of Administration

The "Daily Telegraph" says that the Iraq Foreign Minister (Seyid Tawfik) has brought a plan for a Palestine settlement aiming at Arab-Jewish co-operation in creating a British-occupied State, similar to Iraq.

The plan includes (1) Administration to be gradually transferred from Britain to a Palestine independent State; (2) all people of Palestine to be guaranteed political and civil rights, regardless of race or creed; (3) all commitments to have equal rights; (4) full municipal powers to be granted to Arab and Jewish towns and villages; (5) the number of Jewish residents not to be increased; (6) 40,000 British troops to be stationed; (7) Britain to guarantee all granted rights.

A Jerusalem meeting says that British intention would be to retain and operate behind and gradually transfer them whenever they have been.

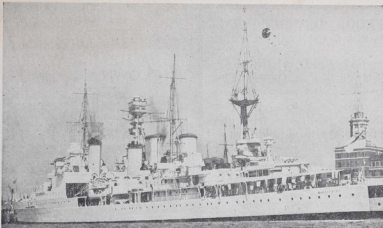

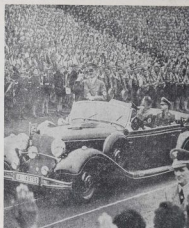

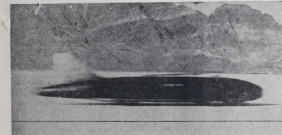

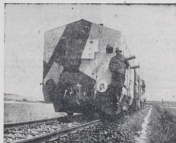

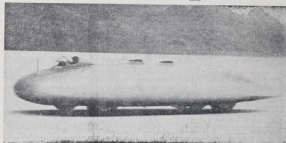
TWENTY RALLY AT BIRMINGHAM—New Model being the X-ray-er's Station after taking part in the River Trust Demonstration.

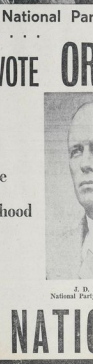
