

Suited To Their Jobs

The present organisation will en-deavour to recruit, train and equip itself to meet any emergency. It will be the aim of the Women's Voluntary Services to make sure that every woman who enrolls is given a job to which she is suited.

The regional officers are now engaged in discussing the organisation with local authorities; learning the needs of the various communities and discovering what services could be taken over by women in the event of an emergency. Re-gional units are then to be estab-

lished in every county or borough with a population of 50,000.
