American Plan to Deal With Problem in Germany and Austria

The American State Department has proposed to Britain, France, Belgium, Holland, Scandinavia, Italy, Switzerland and all Latin American countries that without augmenting the number of immigrants permitted under existing legislation in the various countries, a committee should be created to facilitate the emigration of political refugees from Austria and Germany.

The financing of emergency emigration would be undertaken by private organizations in the respective countries.

DEPENDENCE ON BOTH AMERICA AND BRITAIN

Open Statement of Canada's Position: Millions More For Defence

The Canadian Minister for National Defence (Mr Ian Mackenzie) openly stated that Canada is depending for her security in the Pacific on the presence of a friendly American Fleet and on the British Fleet for Atlantic security.

Mr Mackenzie proposed to Parliament a single year's defence expenditure of 15,000,000 to supplement last year's £2,200,000. It is less than half America's appropriation, and it is an open secret that the Government expects to repeat and perhaps increase the amount annually until the European situation has improved.

Mr Mackenzie said Canada was buying two destroyers and 75 airplanes and increasing the annual training of pilots, and was constructing the second stage of Pacific fortifications.

The Minister made it clear that the Dominion is relying for defence chiefly on guns and planes.

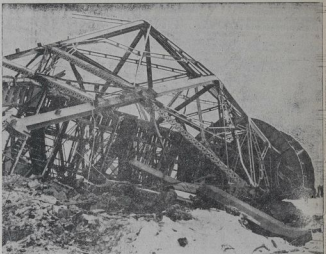
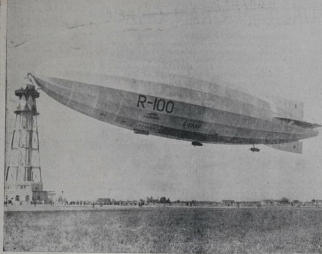

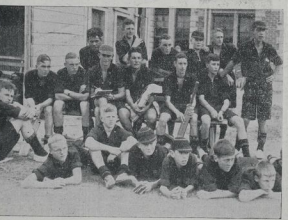
