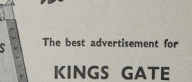

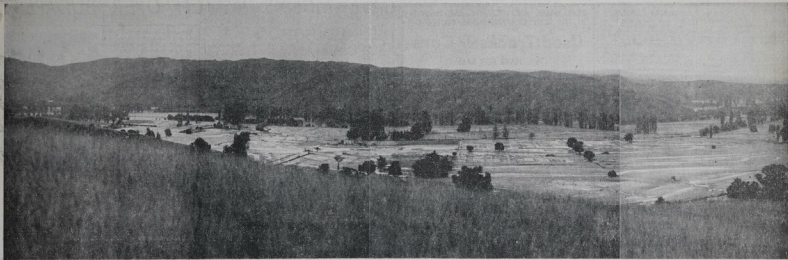

America's western defenses are being developed along a 5000-mile line cutting from north of Seattle across the Pacific and anchored by five islands, says the Washington correspondent of the "New York Herald Tribune." The general programme for these operations was started at Dutch Harbor, Unalaska, and Kodiak. The line for which the total cost will be \$100 million is as follows:— 3000-1000 miles to Midway Island. South-east 1800 miles to Canton Island. South 700 miles to Peapack Point. Active naval bases at Midway Island are also ordered, and the same at Wake Island. The islands are well equipped with powerful long range stations, patrol planes will be able to cover the long line, cutting the Pacific and putting it under observation in advance.

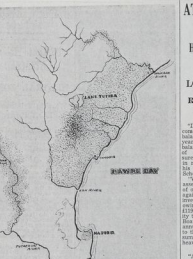

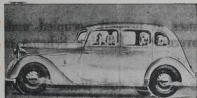
