MOBILISED RUMANIAN TROOPS AWAIT NEXT MOVE FROM GERMANY

KING CAROL AIMS TO PREVENT SUDDEN RAID IN NORTH

POSSIBLE NEXT STEP BY HUNGARY

Two hundred thousand Rumanian troops are mobilised in the north and east along the Hungarian frontier awaiting Germany's next move.
King Carol has declined to justify military measures to prevent a sudden shock and gain raid to the north.
The Budapest correspondent of "The Times" says that it is estimated that Hungary has mobilised 300,000 men, of which the purification of Rumania is regarded as excessive. It is officially stated in Budapest that Hungarian troops are at least of their Rumanian objectives.

It is reported from the Hungarian frontier that 35 Hungarian SS-panzer divisions have been ordered to move. Many others have been placed under arms.

According to a Berlin message the Hungarian Premier (Karl Rakosi) telegraphed to the German Foreign Minister (Ernst von Ribbentrop) thanking him for the understanding shown by Hungary's claim for co-operation and the repatriation of its soldiers.

He added that a further step had been taken in the interests of the peaceful settlement of the Central European problem.

London reports of increased military activity in Hungary, including the calling up of reservists, many of whom have been sent to the Hungarian frontier, are reported with misgivings.

It is considered that Germany might strike Hungary to attempt to regain the Hungarian minority area from Rumania.

Then Germany would attack Rumania on the ground of the necessity of halting Hungary.


