Nazis Routed in Major Soviet Troops Invasions

ARTILLERY DAZES ATTACKERS Picked Troops Hurlled Back From French Lines

TEN-HOUR BARRAGE PRECEDES THE ASSAULT

French Soldiers Stand Firm in Newly Dug Trenches

GERMANS ROUTED BY BAYONET CHARGE

(Received September 17, 11.35 p.m.)

The biggest battle on the Western Front resulted in the crushing defeat of the Nazis, according to military dispatches reaching Paris late yesterday.

This refers to the repulsing of vigorous Nazi counter-attacks on the French lines in the valley. These waves of Nazi infantry and massed tanks utterly failed to breach the French lines on the Saar front.

An official French communique last night says: "The enemy is continuing to send up reinforcements to oppose our lines. They abandoned and destroyed the range and massed Nazi tank formations yesterday. A big battle raged in the loop of the Nied River adjacent to the Saar on the French frontier north from the village of Niederhoff."

Reports state that the attacking Nazi formations were hurled back, despite heroic shelling, assisted by scores of Nazi planes diving-bombing onto the French positions.

Fresh Nazi troops were brought up from Trier, but the French front firm despite an intense trench warfare. They are reported to have navigated the oncoming formations in newly-dug trenches. The French artillery speedily found the range and massed Nazi tank formations were blown up, resulting in the severest Nazi losses.

The French threw back the initiative and charged the dazed attackers, bayonets turning it into a rout.

The German High Command, at the outset, brought up 100,000 picked troops in an endeavour to prevent the French gaining a footing on a rugged plateau forming a triangle between the Nied River and the Saar, from which French guns would not only dominate the industrial town of Saarbrücken but would reach the main Siegfried Line within range.

The retreating Nazis destroyed the Trier-Metz railway line, which was kept up last week. The French Prime Minister (M. Daladier), accompanied by General Dumergue, Chief of the Military Staff, issued a surprise visit to the Maginot Line on Saturday.

RUSSIAN INVADERS ENGAGED IN BATTLE

BEELIN, Sept. 17.

The German Propaganda Ministry reports that Russian troops invaded Poland on Sunday at 4 a.m. Moscow time.

Prior to this a Note was handed to the Polish Ambassador in Moscow informing him that Soviet troops would cross the Polish frontier at 4 a.m. on September 17.

A later Berlin message states that the crossing was effective on the entire 500 miles of frontier from Poznan to the north to Kamenskopoduk. The Polish Government has asked the Soviet Government to protect Soviet interests and the Russo-White Ukrainian territories.

The Soviet insisted on maintaining neutrality despite this military action. But it was stated that the invasion between Russia and Poland was cancelled because the Polish State could no longer be regarded as free and existent.

The British Ministry of Information states that the Government has not received confirmation of Russian-Polish fighting, but it is endeavouring to ascertain the facts, realising the anxiety created in view of "a momentous decision with which Britain may be faced."

An earlier Paris message said that Russian troops were concentrating at Minsk and Vitebsk. It was believed that the Soviet and the Nazis had other agreed to partition Poland. But that the Soviet was preparing to back up its claim to certain territories if the German troops were to advance.

The British United Press Moscow correspondent reports that Russian warplanes machine-gunned and forced down a German bomber near Lugovoi in the Ukraine. Five members of the crew were detained.

A London message reports that the first Soviet-Polish fighting broke out at the Lublinski junction on the Warsaw-Lodz railway. The fighting lasted for several hours.

Official Polish sources state that fighting started between the Russians and Poles at 5.30 a.m.

The German news agency in Berlin has issued a communique containing the advance report of the Army lists.
