PHILATELIC SOCIETY'S MEETING IN Napier

The first exhibition of stamps was held at the Hotel Metropole, Napier, on Saturday evening, Sept. 23.

The exhibition proved to be a great success, and the members present were greatly pleased with the results.

It is hoped that the meeting will be repeated next year.

What is more important still, the climate of speculation and competition which now prevails in the philatelic world has been somewhat relieved.

While all are recognisant that propaganda has a definite place in the modern war, the present world-wide exhibitions and meetings must inevitably tend to dilute reactions and susceptibilities to the point where explanations will be disregarded without more than perfunctory attention by the average collector.

A month has now gone by since war was declared, and by now we have not a clear conception of the course of war and its effect on the world. We are still awaiting the broad outlines in the world will add one worth-while contribution to our understanding. One is now justified in pointing out the rôle of the philatelist in the present situation, and the justice of our cause, nor do we require a tedious restatement of our aims.

What is more important still, the climate of speculation and competition which now prevails in the diplomatic situation has by now assumed such familiar characteristics that even the elements of truth which may be present are in danger of being overlooked.

In short, the time has arrived when the people should be told the simple facts and the plain truth without a pernicious influence of propaganda.

One recognises the need for secrecy in some things, and one recognises the right of the people to know what is true.

One believes that we receive a fairer presentation of the facts than the German people are allowed to have. But our conviction in the justice of our cause is not based on the fact that it is the right thing to do, but on the fact that we believe in it.

Philatelists should present their case in a simple and dignified manner.

HORSE POWER THE BASIS

By Telegraph-Poole Association

PARLIAMENT BUILDINGS, Oct. 5.

The Minister of Supply (the Hon. D. G. Sulivan) stated to-day that the general position regarding petrol supplies in the country was satisfactory, and that there was no easing of the present restrictions.

"It was recognized that a loss of 10 gallons a month to all drivers would be introduced if that was the small amount we could afford to give," said Mr. Sulivan.

"It was decided to make the distribution on a more equitable basis by allowing an increase of 50 per cent to those drivers who had a rating (R.A.C. rating).

"Arrangements are being made for the issue of a limited number of one-eighth coupons to owners of cars of over twelve-horse-power.

The coupons will be numbered in the same way as the present coupons and will be available each month according to the R.A.C. rating. The new coupons will be obtainable from post offices on and after Monday, October 16, and those numbered 4 to 8 should include 50 per cent.

"I feel sure," concluded Mr. Sulivan, "that this proposal will be generally acceptable throughout the motoring community."






