NAZI RAIDERS LICKED AGAIN

Bombs Shatter Sunday Peace

DAWN ATTACK ON TOWNS

Crushing Losses Inflicted At Small Cost

LONDON, Aug. 12.

Germany yesterday suffered a further crushing air defeat, the second in four days, when 60 bombers and fighters were shot down during extensive raids on docks and shipping along the south and east coasts, particularly at the Isle of Portland, and Weymouth, and in the Straits of Dover. Twenty-four British fighter pilots are missing.

The entire stretch of skies and waters in southern-eastern England was a vast battleground throughout the day.

The church services proceeded as usual, but they were punctuated by machine-gun fire as the British planes went into action and the coastal batteries along the entire seaford opened up, turning the peaceful Sunday into a day of war.

The German raids were systematically planned. Reconnaissance planes flew over as the dawn was breaking and Messerschmitts followed shortly afterwards and made a determined attack on the balloon barrages over Dover, Portland Island, and Weymouth to clear a way for the squadrons of bombers which, escorted by fighters, launched four main attacks. They were carried out in conjunction with an attack by 20 bombers against a convoy, in which the Germans claim to have sunk an 8000-ton ship, seriously damaged another, and set on fire a 5000-ton ship. British reports say that two escorting warships shot down five attacking bombers.

The R.A.F. Fighter Command, in co-operation with other services, was fully prepared to meet the attacks. Our squadrons were well disposed and when 100 German planes made a surprise attack at a point far from the original targets they found two squadrons of Spitfires waiting.

The Air Ministry says that the casualties at the Isle of Portland and Weymouth were civilians.

It is estimated that the loss in personnel to the Germans in the two raids has amounted to 270 airmen, as against the loss of 37 British fighter pilots.

Two of his Majesty's ships at Portland suffered minor damage from splinters.

Bombs falling on land caused some damage to naval buildings, including a hospital. There were a number of casualties, one fatal.

The official communique describing the action adds that a number of houses in Portland and Weymouth were damaged by bombs, some seriously. Some damage was done to communications. An oil tank was set on fire, but the blaze was soon extinguished.

In their main aim, the attacks on Portland and Weymouth were completely successful. The two warships were only slightly damaged by splinters.

Berlin's Claims

The Air Ministry's communique issued at midnight reporting the destruction of 60 German planes disposed of Germany's exaggerated claims, which had progressively increased throughout the night. The latest report from Berlin admits the loss of only 17 German machines and claims that a total of 89 British planes and eight light balloons were shot down, three convoys of merchantmen and one destroyer sunk, and four merchantmen damaged.

The German planes shot down was an all-white machine with Red Cross markings operating as a reconnaissance plane. The Germans made desperate attempts to rescue their airmen with motor torpedo-boats, suggesting that the R.A.F. successes are draining the number of trained personnel.

Retreat Watched

Thousands of people were in the churches when the full fury of the German mass attacks broke out along the coast from south-east to southwest. It was a gloriously fine day, and observers on the British coast were able to see through their glasses events on the French coast. As the British fighters carried the battle back to the German base a crescendo of anti-aircraft fire rose along the coast.

Spectators during lulls in the raids picked up souvenirs from the sudden re-blazing of the guns sent the majority to cover.

Unconfirmed eye-witness statements concerning the battles describe the shooting down of two Junkers dive-bombers within three minutes by British fighters when the Germans attacked a convoy off the south-east coast. The first machine is described as preparing to dive when a Spitfire appeared and an exchange of machine-gun bullets resulted in the German diving straight into the sea from a height of 2000 feet.

A minute later, another Junkers attacked, and again, according to these accounts, was challenged by a Spitfire, and after a short fight among the clouds the German pilot was seen to bail out, his machine crashing on the foreshore rocks.

Forty Bombs

About 30 Dornier bombers, with an escort of Messerschmitt fighters, participated in a raid on a south-west coastal town. They dropped 40 bombs. Six fell at the highest point in the locality and sent up clouds of earth. Six fell among shipping, but it appears that none scored hits.

In the first actions in the morning over south-east coastal towns, a fierce dog-fight resulted in eight German fighters being shot down. Later, diving down from a great height, German fighters attacked balloon barrages on the south-east coast. One balloon was set on fire, and its cable, freed from the blazing envelope, came down with a lash like an enormous whip. The ground defences, putting up a terrific wall of fire, prevented a second wave of Messerschmitts from reaching their objectives.

Hail of Bullets

In the afternoon several squadrons of Messerschmitts raided a south-eastern town for the third time and attacked barrage balloons, on which they swooped at 400 miles an hour. A hail of bullets from the leading plane sent a balloon down in flames. The remaining raiders abandoned the attack. No bombs were dropped.

Many houses were wrecked in a raid on two south-west towns. The casualties are believed to be slight. Direct hits destroyed a brewery and damaged another brewery. Many houses over an area of half a square mile in this part of the town were reduced to ruins.

Children Escape

A children's service was in progress in a chapel when the raid began. The children took shelter under the wall. All escaped unhurt.

A whole family was wiped out among a number of fatalities resulting from German bombing of a Welsh town. Scores of houses and shops were damaged.

BRITISH TROOPSHIP STRUCK BY TORPEDO IN THE ATLANTIC

Heavy Seas Hamper Launching Of The Lifeboats

SURVIVORS LANDED

LONDON, Aug. 12.

The Mahomed Ali El Kebr (7290 tons), carrying troops and naval ratings, was torpedoed in the Atlantic at night and sank in two hours.

A nearby ship picked up 740 survivors out of the 860 persons aboard, and landed them at a Scottish port.

Those missing are mostly soldiers who were in their bunks when the explosion occurred.

Heavy seas made it difficult to launch the lifeboats. A number of soldiers who jumped overboard when the transport listed were drowned.

The rescue ship continued till late in the morning picking up troops clinging to rafts and wreckage. Some of the lifeboats were swamped.

William Olley, the ship's canteen manager, said: "The ship's doctor and the army doctor showed magnificent devotion to duty in attending to the injured regardless of their own safety. It was an anxious time getting the stretcher cases to the boats."

"The captain, by his courage and calmness, inspired everybody. He and the two doctors, the chief officer and the chief wireless operator are all missing."

Many of the survivors, who were almost naked, were given new uniforms when they came ashore.

PICNICS RELIEVE TEDIUM OF ANZACS' DESERT CAMP

War Observes No Holiday, So Arms Are Always Near-By

WELLINGTON, Aug. 12.

Weekly picnics which, in a sense, must be the strangest ever known, have been inaugurated for members of the first contingent of the Second New Zealand Expeditionary Force in Egypt. The purpose of the picnics, which are held in surroundings of trees, gardens, and green lawns, is to enable the men to relax under conditions completely different from those of their desert camp, reports the New Zealand Expeditionary Force Official News Service in a dispatch dated July 22.

Because the war observes no holiday, however, arms and ammunition must be carried by every soldier attending the picnics. Thus, the incongruous spectacle of stacked rifles, machine-guns, and mounted anti-aircraft guns is seen in the peaceful parks and gardens wherein the outings are held as a relief from the heat and glare of the desert.

Stretches of turf and clumps of shady trees have enhanced the attraction for many members of the force, who are content to stretch themselves on the grass and pass the time dozing, reading, or even writing letters.

Two of the picnic sites, however, are popular sightseeing places at which there is much of interest to be seen. One of these is the Cairo Zoo, and the other the irrigation works on the River Nile.

Light lunches are taken by the picnic parties when the outing occupies a full day and soft drinks are provided by the New Zealand National Patriotic Board.

LONDON, Aug. 12.

The Delgrade correspondent of the "Daily Express" says: "As Italy, in the name of Albanian nationalism, began a hate campaign against Greece, demanding the liberation of a 60-mile zone of Greek territory, a revolt against Italy flared up in Albania."

The Mriditi tribe rebelled when Italians tried to force them to join the army. Italian officers are reported to have been shot while requisitioning Albanian food and cattle.

The "Daily Mail's" Athens correspondent says: "The revolts in Albania began on August 9 and are spreading. The leaders, the Kurveles tribe, have notified the Italians that they refuse to supply food-stuffs and will disobey the mobilisation orders."

"They demanded the release of Albanians imprisoned at Tirana. Many Albanians have been imprisoned for distributing leaflets urging young men to flee to the woods to escape being forced into war 'against the liberators of small nations.'"

SNIPERS DO DAMAGE

LONDON, Aug. 12.

The "Daily Mail's" Cairo correspondent says that Italian forces from Hargeisa and Oadweina are in the fringes of British Somaliland hills, in which an engagement with British forces is imminent. Scouts and reconnoitering planes report the Italians' every movement. Snipers hidden in the barren foothills pick off soldiers relentlessly, cutting off and rounding up stragglers. At night Somali warriors creep up and overwhelm sentries and outposts and cause havoc in the enemy camps.

Stunted thorn trees provide the only protection for the Italians, but the British have built stone redoubts and machine-gun nests.

It is announced at Cairo that reconnaissance of enemy activities continue. In Somaliland, contact has not yet been established on the main positions. The situation of Burao and to the east is normal. There is nothing to report in Palestine, Kenya and the Sudan."

Hurricane Strikes South Carolina

The Red Cross announced today that a hurricane struck Charleston, South Carolina, at 7 p.m. with full force, the velocity of the wind being from 75 to 100 miles an hour.

It said that the hurricane was moving northward and was expected to reach Georgetown, South Carolina, at 11 p.m.

When Hitler moved to the oratorical stand to make his stop-the-war demand on Britain, Reichstag members and visitors prepared themselves for a long sitting, says "Cavalcade," the British news magazine.

Schacht advised Hitler that some leading British capitalists might be prepared to cut the loss and enter an agreement if Germany provided terms not too harsh.

Food, although not scarce, is by no means plentiful. Prices are rising. Women are learning of the death of sons and husbands.

Behind Hitler's speech are demands and plans which cannot be known at this stage. But a Madrid correspondent learns the following general lay-out of Hitler's peace scheme:

Deaths From Exposure "That night 19 of the chaps died of exposure and our number had gradually dwindled down to seven when we were picked up at 4 o'clock on the morning of June 11 by a Norwegian trawler.
