**AUCKLAND, May 17.**  
The Waikato Racing Club's winter meeting has increased in importance in the last few years and the stakes the club can offer are substantial and little below those of the principal metropolitan clubs.

Even in the Te Rapa Steeples will provide a good contest, especially as Clarion Call, early favourite for the Great Northern Steeples, is the top-weight, at 12.5. This is 9lbs more than his Egmont Steeples weight, but the racing there should go far to counterbalance the added prize at Te Rapa. It is safe to assume all going well that Clarion Call will be a warm favourite.

All Irish, En Tour, Mio Lume and Biform, the next four on the list, are the only ones who contested the Te Rapa Steeples last year. All Irish being third to the surprise winner, Riotous. Of the quartette, En Tour has the best recent credentials, with the Adamson Steeples behind him.

Although he disappointed at Pukekohe, where he probably has been ridden to better advantage, Baldric will count many friends on the strength of his St. Heliers Hurdles success at Ellerslie in March.

**Streamline in Demand.**

Speculators are not likely to go beyond Streamline in search for the Waikato Hurdles favourite. He has been doing well since his arrival at Te Rapa. His chief opponents may be Loombination, who won on the course, and he probably has been winner in his last three starts over the battens, including the Avondale Hurdles with 10.11 and Aussie Ra, who is expected to be improved by his racing here.

There is a tendency for speculators to take the result of the President's Handicap at Pukekohe a few days ago as a true guide to the similarly named contest at Te Rapa.

There, Foxsen, Namara and Bronze Moth took part in a very keen finish. Jack Tar, Gold Vaals and Sunny Downs also have a following.

Gold Vaals has been consistently in demand and it is recalled that Royal Appella has been close up in all his recent races since winning the Vercoe Handicap at the Waikato February meeting. Jack Tar likes the left-handed going and the easy track will also suit him.

Two who appear to this contest to hold good chances in the Stewards' Handicap are Silver Quex and Te Takina. The former had 7.4 when he won at Pukekohe; now he has 7lbs more, while Te Takina remains on the minimum. Olympus, who divided them, has gone up 1lb on weight carried and on his home track he should again stretch the other two.

In the absence of Dauber, who was scratched on Wednesday afternoon, Flashlight may have a better public than Aintree or Mahala in the Melville Steeples.

The first division of the Otorohanga Handicap appears to be the stronger. 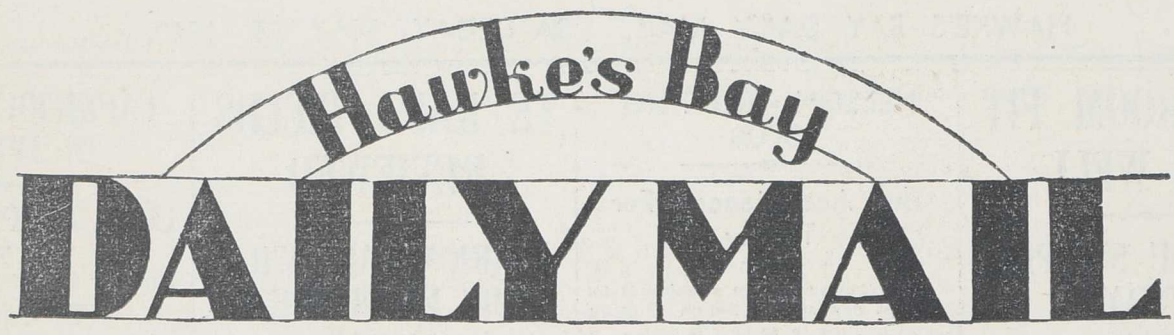
