PATRIOTIC QUEEN CROWNED WITH CEREMONY

Successful Green And Gold Ball Held In Hastings

The crowning of the Patriotic Queen was the outstanding feature of the very successful Green and Gold Ball which was held in the Hastings Assembly Hall last evening and which was sponsored by the combined Korongata, Te Hauke, and Heretaunga Mutual Improvement Association.

The ceremony of crowning the queen, Mrs R. N. Hapuku, of Te Hauke, was performed by the Mayor of Hastings (Mr G. A. Maddison), who extended to her his cordial congratulations. He thanked the Maori people for their generosity in giving the funds from the ball for patriotic work and for their continued splendid co-operation at all times.

The hall presented a very gay appearance with long streamers of flags and multi-coloured light shades. These decorations and all the very capable arrangements had been made by the following splendid committee:—

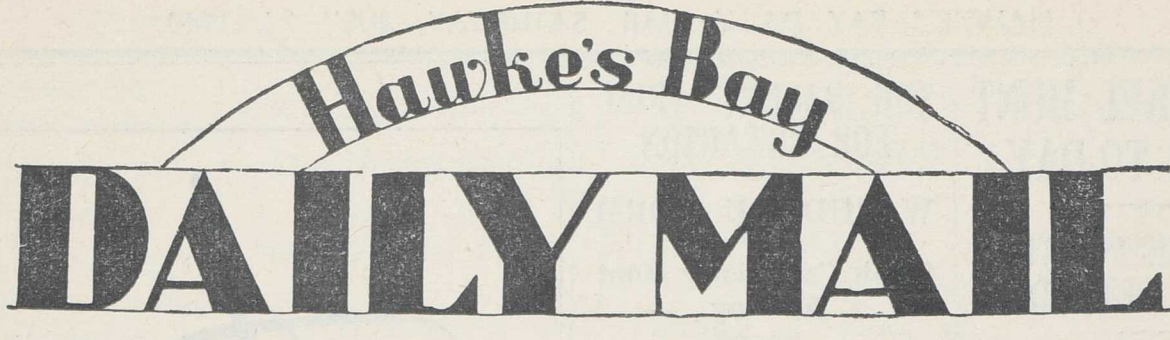
