Sir Beau Paralyzes The Opposition WELLINGTON GUINEAS WIN

The Ring And Sir Crusoe At Tall Prices

By Telegraph-Press Association. WELLINGTON, Oct. 26. Sir Beau showed very clearly in the Wellington Guineas today that he was the unlucky runner in the Great Northern Guineas, where he not only met with interference but was also unsuited by the right-hand going. He also demonstrated his liking for Trentham where he is undefeated in three starts.

The field dwindled down to the select colts of the year, five taking part in the newly established classic. Lambourn made the running to the false rail where Beau Leon and Sir Beau ranged up alongside the Hastings three-year-old. A furlong from home Lambourn was beaten and in the next half furlong Sir Beau came right away from Beau Leon to win handsomely by three lengths. Sir Beau was far superior and his performance gives him a lien on the New Zealand Derby next month.

Beau Leon seemed to travel over a little extra ground in the first half mile, but he was beaten on his merits and, as he has won up to ten furlongs this season in good company, his eclipse emphasises the merits of Sir Beau's performance.

Enrich was ridden a waiting race, being fourth into the straight. The patient tactics adopted with him enabled him to finish on over the last furlong to just beat Lambourn for third. The latter might have done better ridden in behind, but he was too well beaten for any strong hopes to be held out for sufficient improvement before Derby Day.

The Great Northern Guineas winner, Sir Cameron, never threatened danger, and he made no impression on the leaders in the straight. He certainly appears to have been very lucky at Ellerslie.

THE RING, who stopped a bad kick at the barrier the first day, atoned for her defeat in the Wellington Handicap, by a brilliant success in the Watkins Handicap. The Hastings mare finished full of running in the last furlong and as she was going away on the post, her performance will hearten her admirers for the New Zealand Cup.

There was a wonderful race for the minor placings and the Wanganui mare Homily dashed up in the last fifty yards to snatch second money by half a head from the favourite, Sly Fox, with Little Robin only a head away.

Windsor Chief and Ned Cuttle attended to most of the running, the pair being several lengths clear a mile from home, with Amigo, The Ring, Trench Law, and Homily at the head of the remainder. Ned Cuttle dropped back at the five furlongs and, as they rounded the home turn, Amigo and Sly Fox came up on the outside of the pacemaker, with Ned Cuttle, The Ring, Arcas and Trench Law next.

Amigo hit the front at the false rail, but his effort was short-lived. The Ring going through to head Sly Fox a long way off the post. Little Robin, wide out, then commenced a fast run and Homily came into the picture shortly afterwards, but The Ring won rather easily.

Little Robin suffered a check five furlongs from home and could not get through until past the false rail. He looked unlucky to miss a place, so her performance easily at the false rail, but was once more proved a non-stayer, stopping to a walk at the finish.

Four in a Line Improved immensely by his race at Otaki this month Sir Crusoe recaptured the winning list in the Awatea Handicap. He was a good score. It was a great finish, half a length separating Sir Crusoe, Mittie, Vascones and Not Out, but Sir Crusoe is a class horse placed to his best form.

Mittie was not well backed early, but drove through at the false rail and reached the front a furlong off the post. However, she could not quite hold Sir Crusoe at the false rail, but was once more proved a non-stayer, stopping to a walk at the finish.

THE RING atoned for her defeat the first day at Trentham by scoring convincingly in the big event on Saturday.

Recollection won the Rimu Hurdles in the easiest possible manner, but he carelessly handled in the run home from the last fence and, as he interfered with Great Fair, the stewards had no option but to reverse the placings. Great Fair deserved his win for he is most consistent, but Recollection should not have been beaten.

Scoring his third successive victory by taking the Belmont Handicap the Ngatarawa three-year-old Poutatau was most impressive. He had to be kept up to his task all the way and, despite the fact that it was his first race since July, he battled on gamely in a desperate finish to win convincingly. The effort brings him before notice as a Stewards' Handicap prospect.

Great Fair made practically all the running from Dorado, and Recollection was ultra-confidently handled tailing the field until half a mile from home. He then picked up the leaders with ease as they ran down to the last fence.

Dorado weakened into third place, being well clear of Son and Heir, who hit the fence at the five furlongs when out with Great Fair in the lead. Golden Memory, the only other runner, jumped poorly throughout.

A Runaway Win Belle Cane, who created such a good impression when she opened last month, made the opposition look cheap in the Trial Stakes. She was not too well placed in the first quarter, but ran up behind the leader, joining the pace-maker in the Grand Chase at the false rail. In the run home Belle Cane was never off the steel and her effort suggests that she is one of the best staying fillies seen out in recent years.

Sanction came from the clouds over the last two furlongs to run second at long odds from Talenta, who showed that her Stratford form was good by being in the picture all the way. Social Credit made up some ground from the false rail to be fourth from Grand Chase, Pleading and Cheerful Lady.

Grand Chase stopped badly in the run home after making the pace to the false rail from Sir Rabbi, Cheerful Lady and Talenta.

Charles Edward Again Confirming the high impression formed of him earlier in the year Charles Edward was responsible for a splendid performance in winning the Hetaunga Handicap in a desperate finish over the last furlong. Don Quex, Charles Edward, Serenata, Goldbridge, Gay Fox and Airline were lined across the course a furlong from home, but Charles Edward rose to the occasion magnificently and won going away from the Hastings-owned Serenata, who ran a wonderful race under her 9.9.

Only heads away from Serenata were Goldbridge, Don Quex (whose rider lost an iron), Gay Fox and Airline. The favourite, Kilometre, who had anything but a good run, did well to finish seventh, ahead of Autosweep and Arabic. The latter threatened danger at the false rail, but did not run on.

Goldbridge ran well throughout, but Don Quex looked to be a little unlucky.
