Beau Vite Adds To Admirers For Melbourne Cup

Brilliant Win Over High Caste In The MacKinnon Stakes

Lucrative's Derby Gold Salute's Cantala Stakes Win Impresses The Critics

The weather was dull, but there was a good attendance for the first day of the V.R.C. meeting at Flemington yesterday. The going was good, but a head wind militated against fast times.

The V.R.C. Derby opened sensationally. Pandect was side-on when the barrier rose and was further hampered by a collision with Warbird both hopelessly left. Lucrative's rider Maurice McCarten said that the colt always had the race won and he should have a great show in the Melbourne Cup. Lucrative has now won £11,200 in stakes. The sectional times were: First half-mile in 52 1/2; last four furlongs in 49 1/2; last six in 1:13 1/2.

Whether Lucrative will run in the Cup will be decided on Monday. McCarten considers that the colt will run out two miles, but trainer H. Freedman will be guided by the owner's wishes.

The N.Z.-bred Gold Salute was prominent always and won the Cantala Stakes comfortably. Judean came second and Remarc finished third. Mure was fourth and Bankshaw a moderate fifth. Amiable ran a poor race.

Gold Salute has now had three wins and a second in his last four starts. The New Zealand horse Beau Vite had his sixth successive victory in the MacKinnon Stakes. High Caste was with him two furlongs from the post, but was outclassed in the final stages. Historian was a fair third, but Maikai disappointed.

Beau Vite has now won £18,410 in stakes. The pace was slow early, and the first five furlongs taking 1:31 and the last four 48 1/2. Beau Vite greatly pleased his Melbourne Cup admirers. Session directed attention to her Oaks prospects by an impressive win in the Wakeful Stakes. True-ness was second and showed improved form. Stylish was a good third. Darby Munro, the rider of Session, won the Wakeful Stakes previously on Siren.

The Gimcrack Stakes winner All Love outclassed the Marbyrnong Plate field. She cost 250zins, as a yearling. With two starts for two wins she is one of the most promising youngsters in recent years. Portable finished well to beat Marbyrnong for place honours. The rider D. Munro won previously on Broad-caster and Fidelity.

Dashing Cavalier directed attention to his Cup chance by a brilliant finish for third in the Hotham Handicap. Gladynne looked a winner a furlong from home, but was unable to withstand the challenge. Saint Warden, who showed his best Melbourne form, was third and Wilson a fair fourth. Giltown gave a poor display and was third to last. H. Hadger and J.
