## Masked Movement Of Troops Into Bulgaria

### THREAT TO SALONIKA

## Germans In Force Expected At Any Moment

(United Press Association—Copyright.) (Received February 23, 9.55 p.m.) LONDON, Feb. 22.

Whether the Germans' march into Bulgaria has actually and openly begun or whether the process of infiltration has been intensified preparatory to invasion is not yet definitely able to be stated. The "Daily Express" says that messages picked up by its radio station at 2 a.m. indicated that large German forces had been crossing the Danube into Bulgaria in the last 36 hours and the movements are continuing.

The "Daily Mail" says: "Hitler's march into Bulgaria has begun, in fact it is not officially. German troops according to reports via Belgrade, have been crossing the Danube since noon on Friday by pontoon bridges over the river at 17 points. They are now reported to be concentrating on the Bulgarian side of the river."

"German troops are reported to have passed through Sofia during the night to take up positions in the Struma Valley on the vital road to Salonika."

The "Daily Mail's" special correspondent says that this may account for the fact that the Bulgarian authorities refused permission to the British Minister to travel by that road when he wanted to visit the Greek frontier.

German motorised equipment filled all garages in Bucharest today and overflowed into the streets and squares, where uniformed men were busy adjusting motors, loading lorries and filling petrol tanks. Mechanics had established workshops in the streets and were giving the equipment the final overhaul. Streams of loaded lorries later moved off toward the Danube.

Nervous Tension

"The Times" Sofia correspondent says: "Bulgaria is living nervously through the last few days of her independence. The Germans are expected at any moment. In the last few days they threw several pontoon bridges across the Danube and lifted them again, obviously carrying out exercises. The Germans have openly occupied almost all the villas and country houses around Sofia, in which many German military cars driven by youths in mufti which everybody knows will soon change for uniforms."

The "Manchester Guardian" summing up the shipping situation says: "British and Allied neutral losses from enemy action during the war amount to 4,635,300 tons. The merchant fleets of the United Kingdom, the Dominions and Hong Kong amounted to 21,000,000 tons before the war, of which only about half was available for traffic between the United Kingdom and overseas countries. The German occupation of western and northern Europe and the war in the Mediterranean have still further reduced the fleet's carrying capacity. The convoy system, the partial closing of the east coast ports and the transfer of tonnage to military purposes have also diminished its effective use."

## Free French Forces Make First Landing At Red Sea Port

(United Press Association—Copyright.) (Received February 24, 1.15 a.m.) LONDON, Feb. 23.

For the first time since the attack on Eritrea began British and Allied troops have landed forces on the Red Sea coast, where Free French detachments which came overland in lorries from Chad to the Sudan disembarked to join the drive on Keren. The detachments brought rifles, machine-guns and all equipment except artillery, which the British supplied.

Their commander is a colonel who left Vichy in November.

"I hope that the news of our arrival in Eritrea will bring many more Frenchmen to our cause," he said. "The majority of Frenchmen are pro-British and many would join General de Gaulle, but it is difficult to leave France."

RECIPIES FOR THE ENTERPRISING HOUSEWIFE

Many Delicious Home Made Wines Are Very Simple To Make

PASSIONFRUIT WINE

Take 4 dozen ripe passionfruit and scoop out the insides. Pour over them 4 quarts of water and allow to soak for 36 hours. Then add 4lb. sugar and 1oz. gelatine and allow to stand five days. Strain and bottle, leaving the corks off. After about six months the corks may be rammed in tightly and the wine is ready after about 12 months. The longer it is kept the better, but do not cork tightly until it has stood for the six months.

RHUBARB WINE

Here are three well tested recipes for rhubarb wine:

(1) To every three pints of rhubarb — cut very small — allow one quart of tap water. Stir every day and let stand 14 days. Then strain off. Allow 1lb granulated sugar to every quart of liquid. Add a little yeast and allow to ferment. Bottle in about 14 days, but better kept in cask and bottled later.

(2) Choose young stalks. Cut into small pieces. To 7lb of rhubarb allow 2 gallons of boiling water, pour over and let it stand in a stone jar for three days. Then add 7lb of sugar. Allow to stand 12 more days. Pour into bottles, then leave uncorked for a month. Put a piece of net or muslin over bottle to keep flies out. Cork down for use; the longer kept the better it is.

(3) Pour 1lb rhubarb to 1 lemon. Strain and to the gallon allow 4lb sugar (i.e. 1lb to each quart). Warm enough in a saucepan to make the whole lukewarm. Stir well. Then put in 3oz yeast and a little isinglass, let it work well over. When it appears to have done working put it in a wooden spoon, strain the liquor and to each gallon of juice add 4lb sugar. When the sugar is dissolved pour the liquor into a cask and when it ceases fermenting close the bung hole and leave it for six or eight months, then bottle and cork tightly and store in a dark room.

PLUM AND RAISIN WINE

Gather the plums dry and ripe. Stone them and mash the pulp. To each 8lb. of pulp add 2lb. crushed raisins and one gallon of boiling water. Let it stand together for two days, then strain off the juice and for each gallon of juice add 1lb. brown sugar and stir until dissolved. Then place in a cask, filling it to the brim, close the bung loosely, and let the juice work for four or five days. Then close the bung hole tightly and let stand for 12 months before using or drawing off from the sediment.

If a less alcoholic wine is desired close the bung hole of the cask tightly after putting in the liquor and let it stand in a cool place for 12 months.

ELECTRIC BULBS AND TORCHES

Import Restrictions Relaxed

By Telegraph—Press Association WELLINGTON, Feb. 22. Restrictions on the importation of incandescent filament electric light bulbs have been relaxed, and it will now be possible to obtain some supplies from overseas of the type used for domestic purposes.

Previously only filament electric lamp bulbs having a power consumption exceeding 150 watts could be imported under the fifth import schedule, the intention of the Government being that for domestic bulbs dependence should be on the production of a recently-established industry in the Dominion.

A 50 per cent. cut in the importation of electric torch cases has also been lifted. Importers may now obtain licences from the United Kingdom to the value of their 1935 imports from all sources.

TESTING AMERICAN OPINION

Americans have a peculiar enthusiasm for unofficial polls as a means of testing public opinion, and although the voters comprise a comparatively small proportion of the population of voting age, the results in the case of presidential elections at least, have been proved in the past to give a surprisingly accurate indication of the trend of opinion in the nation at large.

The latest Gallup survey, the results of which are given in a cable message this morning, is extremely interesting in that it shows that a considerable body of United States citizens hold the belief that developments in the Far East have a vital bearing on the interests of the United States and that a majority of those who voted have entirely abandoned the isolationist theories which for so long were a decisive factor in American policy.

In this particular poll the subjects were the Japanese threat to Singapore and other British bases, the possibility of a Japanese descent on the Netherlands East Indies, and the question of whether the United States should be prepared to take action to prevent a Japanese victory in either of those areas on the grounds that such a success would constitute an immediate threat to American interests.

The essential point of the voting was that a majority of the voters expressed the belief that a substantial section of United States opinion would be prepared to "risk war if necessary" in order to keep Japan from raising her flag at Singapore or taking over the Dutch East Indies. Sixty per cent voted "yes" on the question of whether American interests would be threatened by a Japanese occupation of Singapore or the Dutch islands; 56 per cent replied "yes" to the question of whether United States interests would be threatened in the event of such Japanese action, while on the point of "risking war" in order to prevent Japanese action 39 per cent voted "yes" and 46 per cent "no."

On these three questions the voting shows that the Americans, or that section of them which was concerned with the Gallup poll, are still in the transition stages regarding the prospect of immediately becoming involved in war, but the poll indicates that the people of the United States have at last brought themselves to take a realistic view of the implications of the present world conflict, and have arrived, after eighteen months, at the point where they are prepared to regard themselves as vitally bound up in the fight against the aggressor Powers of the Axis.

Unofficial as they are, the Gallup polls carry a good deal of weight in America, and the voting in the present instance will not be without influence with the American leaders. If the poll has done nothing else, it has shown that the American public are no longer inclined to act as a brake on any policy which (still "short of war") is designed to keep the Tokyo end of the Axis in check in the Far East and the Pacific.

PAUSE FOR REFLECTION

Japanese spokesmen have been at pains to calm the storm raised by the Australian War Council's sudden expression of alarm, but they have not improved matters by attempting to transfer the blame for all the agitation on the British Empire and the United States. They have brought out the good old German encirclement tale in a mixture of bluster and whine that might have come from Berlin in pre-war days.

Japan is in the unfortunate position of being unable to move without precipitating war on a vast scale in the East, while at the same time her Axis allies are steadily pushing her into war.

Major Reidy N.Z.S.C. Camp Commandant at Dannevirke, has been transferred to Wairoa. Captain L. Neilsen, N.Z.S.C., of Trentham, will succeed Major Reidy at Dannevirke.

The death has occurred of Mr. Alfred Hammond, formerly Chief Detective, Auckland. He joined the police force in 1895 in Wellington and accompanied the late King George V and Queen Mary when they toured the Dominion as the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York. He was transferred to the detective office at Auckland in 1912, remaining there for 20 years before retiring with the rank of chief detective.

The Minister of Public Works (the Hon. H. T. Armstrong) has announced the appointment of Mr. W. L. Newnham as Engineer-in-Chief and Under-Secretary of the Department on the retirement of Mr. J. Wood at the end of the month. Mr. Newnham joined the Public Service in 1906, and has been assistant Engineer-in-Chief and deputy-head of the department since last November.

Mr. J. J. McDonald, formerly of Norsewood, has commenced duties on the staff of the Wairoa Telephone Exchange.

Chief Mechanic T. A. Pearce, of H.M.S. Achilles, son of Mrs. F. G. Fanning, Hastings, and the late Mr. T. A. Pearce, Wairoa, has been promoted to warrant engineer. He was educated at the Hastings Convent.

LITVINOFF "NEGLECTS HIS WORK"

Warning to Air Comissar

United Press Association—Copyright. (Received February 23, 6 p.m.) MOSCOW, Feb. 21. The Communist Conference today removed M. Maxim Litvinoff, former Soviet Foreign Minister and delegate to the League of Nations, from the central committee of the party "for not securing fulfilment of his obligations as a member."

The conference elected the new Russian Ambassador to Berlin, M. Dekanosov, to the committee, with the Ambassador to London, M. Maisky, as a reserve member. Other newcomers to the committee include M. Kuusinen, the Soviet's puppet "Prime Minister" in the Finnish War.

The conference warned M. Kaganovich, Comissar of the Aviation Industry, that, if he does not improve his work, he will be removed from the central committee. The conference also warned the commissars of Military supplies, the commissar of marine and the chemical, fishing, and electrical industries.

ECONOMIC SURVEY PROPOSED HAWKE'S BAY WEATHER

PRIME MINISTER'S VIEW N.Z. WAR EFFORT

All Branches Of Industry By Telegraph—Press Association WELLINGTON, Feb. 22. A proposal for an economic council to survey, advise on and, to some considerable extent, guide the productive and industrial activities of the Dominion during the war period, and thus still further increase the efficiency of the war effort, was announced by the Prime Minister (the Rt. Hon. P. Fraser) to-day.

"This matter has engaged my attention for some time," he said, "and during the past week I mentioned the matter to my colleagues in the Government and the War Cabinet. I also brought it to the notice of the Parliamentary Labour Party caucus during the week.

Workers and Employers "I hope to discuss the project with representatives of the Federation of Labour representing the trade unions, and the Employers' Federation, as well as with others interested during the next week.

"The Government, probably in the near future, may call a conference similar to the Economic Stabilisation Conference held in September and October last, with a view to obtaining the support of all concerned for a truly national co-operative effort in directing which the Government, Parliament, employers and workers' organisations representing all branches of industrial activity, primary and secondary, will participate.

War Difficulties "Possible developments in various fields of war which may detrimentally affect New Zealand shipping and consequently our exports, imports and the whole national life may, and probably will, make inevitable economic difficulties and sacrifices.

"If New Zealand is to emerge from such trials with its economic and social standards intact or recoverable there must be organisation, co-operation and goodwill amongst all the people of the country, and particularly among those directly engaged in industrial activities.

Many Problems "Many and complex problems affecting the workers, including the shortage of skilled labour, as well as materials, demands greater co-operation and, if need be, control, but to be thoroughly efficient that control should be self-accepted and self-operated.

"How this can best be achieved, whether by a thoroughly representative economy council or otherwise, would be the main business of the conference when it is called."

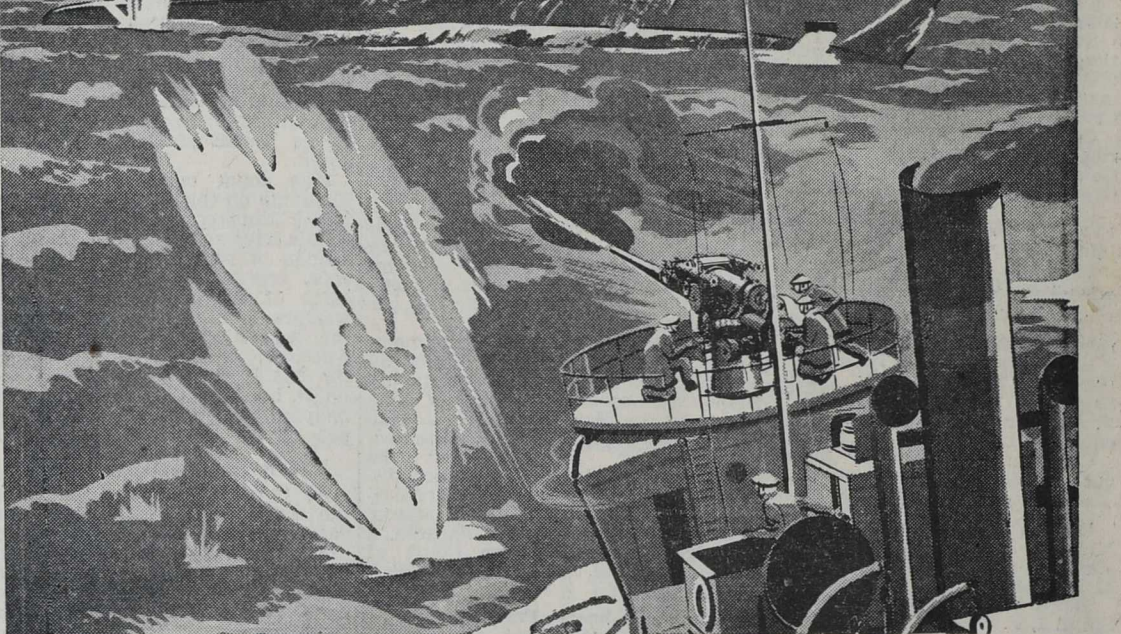
