TO EQUIP YOUR KITCHEN

The Problem Of The Small Flat

Entertaining in a small flat has difficulties which are obvious, so obvious that many people give up the struggle and invite their friends to luncheon or dinner at a restaurant. Yet it is possible to develop a certain technique of special planning by which most of these obstacles may be overcome.

Size of the Kitchen

Let us try in this article to deal with the chief problem, which is usually the size of the kitchen. Over and over again one sees kitchenettes in modern flats, complete with refrigerator, with scarcely room to turn round in, not a corner where food can be kept, except in the refrigerator, and an enamelled-top table to work on, or a wooden flap table with flimsy supports. When once the cooker is alight, everything is enveloped in steam, and if the window is opened out goes the gas; if the door, the smell of cooking pervades the entire establishment, and tempers rise accordingly. If we add to this that the amateur, or simple cook, has sadly inadequate weapons, it does not surprise us if the results are lamentable.

A Good Work Table

The first essential in any kitchen is a marble solid to work upon, a small wooden table, with a top 1 1/2 in. thick. Get it made if necessary, or if space does not allow, then use the flap variety, but equally thick, and with adequate supports, so that you may chop or carve to your heart's content without feeling that the world is slipping away from you. An electric fan, suitably placed, is the best way of controlling the heat.

Two chopping boards, good and solid, are needed. These can stand under the table when not in use. A marble solid fitted to the top of the refrigerator is a godsend, for it is cool for pastry making. The refrigerator must be of a proper height of course.

Shallow cupboards up to the ceiling will store your excess china, and a pair of midge steps should be tucked away somewhere.

One or two first-class knives, a large chef's knife, a medium and a paring knife are better than all the gadgets and far less wasteful.

Necessary Equipment

Other necessary equipment includes: One small round whisk for soups, a larger for egg whites; two boxwood spatulas; instead of wooden spoons; two palette knives, one large, one small, a sharpening steel; a basting spoon and a ladle; a two-pronged cooking fork; a strong pip-

PARTY POLITICS ATTACKED NATIONAL CABINET WANTED FARMERS' UNION

Dominion President's Address (Daily Mail Special Service) WELLINGTON, March 1. Addressing the monthly meeting of the Makara-Hutt Valley Provincial Executive of the New Zealand Farmers' Union, the Dominion president (Mr. W. W. Mulholland) spoke about the gravity of the military and economic situation that was facing the Empire.

The acting Prime Minister of Australia, said the speaker, had drawn attention to the military situation, and there could be no doubt that the next year would be one of very great importance, and would probably decide whether the freedom-loving peoples would be allowed to retain their freedom or whether the world would go back to the dark ages.

Economic Situation Grave The economic situation, as affected by the war, was also becoming increasingly grave. In order to meet the difficulties of the situation which will arise, if large quantities of our goods, exports and imports are shut off, as appears very possible at present, much more drastic action on the part of the Government will be necessary.

If Hitler won it would not matter a jot what political school of thought one might belong. We would all be in a concentration camp. He did not want it to be thought that he was disparaging the activities of the War Cabinet. The War Cabinet had had a marked effect on those matters which had come within its jurisdiction in getting the energy and decision into the war effort of the country, and that was one of the very good reasons that he saw for extending the national Cabinet to cover the whole of the affairs of New Zealand.

Sufficient Eggs In Province PRODUCERS' COMMENT A Shortage Is Not Feared PRESENT SITUATION Referring to a message in which the Minister of Marketing (the Hon. J. G. Rereomua, formerly of Okere, is a direct descendant of chiefs of the Ngatamaru tribe, took advantage of the recently announced Government scheme of training personnel for the Royal Navy in New Zealand, and is thrilled at the possibility of participating shortly in a sea battle.

JUVENILE SUPREMACY

Kindergarten And Sir Beau Clash In Challenge

(By THE BARB.)

Some critics consider that this season's two-year-old supremacy is still an open question and that it will not be until the conclusion of the autumn classics that this situation will be clarified. However, the Vaals-Queen March bay colt, Route March, by virtue of his success in the Great Northern Foal Stakes and the Auckland Racing Club Royal Stakes when beating the Dominion's best juvenile talent, is, in the The Barb's estimation, entitled to the honour and has to be dethroned before any other "baby" can wear the crown.

Next week the North Island Challenge Stakes is to be run at Trentham and although Pay Roll, Foreign Coin and Burra Sahib are engaged, Route March is not, so that this two and three-year-old race will not settle the question. In fact, it will be more of an elimination bout to decide which one of the trio should go north and tackle the Vaals colt in the Great Northern Champagne Stakes at Easter.

Pal Roll dead-headed with Nuna in the Auckland Welcome Stakes in the spring and came out in the second day and beat the Lysander filly in the Musket Stakes to earn the reputation of being the smartest of her age in the Dominion. That summing-up, after the Wellesley Stakes at Trentham, had to be revised when Foreign Coin, Soutane, Premature and Pay Roll finished in that order and as the track was greasy, some were disinclined to take her as a true criterion. Foreign Coin had, however, galloped so impressively in private that his supporters claimed him to be a high class colt.

THE C.J.C. WELCOME STAKES

By winning the C.J.C. Welcome, Pay Roll rehabilitated herself as the "King or Queen of the Kids," but as Foreign Coin was suffering from a slight cold excuses were forthcoming for his defeat into fourth place after getting badly away at the start. On the fourth day at Riccarton the heavy carry of 9st. 5lb. dead-headed in the Pioneer Handicap with Corn Prince just ahead of Salutation (Foreign Coin did not compete). This double success certainly entitled Pay Roll to the title of the best juvenile and it was with this reputation that she went to Auckland in December for the Foal and Royal Stakes.

MEETS HER MASTER

The Cropper filly Pay Roll was beaten by a nose in the Foal Stakes by Route March with Foreign Coin third, half a length away. Route March followed by Pay Roll. As the margin was so small there was little in it so that the Royal Stakes was awaited with interest on the last day. In this race the most stout two-year-old filly, the three-year-old Kraal with Pay Roll a neck away third. The juvenile honours then looked definitely in favour of the northern youngster.

BURRA SAHIB ON THE HORIZON

The next classic was the Wellington Stakes at Trentham, when the field, on paper, did not appear above handicap standard, except for Pay Roll, who was made favourite on both machines, only to run a disappointing third to Lady Acorn, turned up in Burra Sahib, and so convincingly did Mr. F. Ormond's Bulandshar-Province colt win by four lengths that he was immediately claimed as another star on the horizon. Pay Roll was said to be below form last January and as Salutation and Prince Plato also finished ahead of her she undoubtedly was not at her best.

THE AUTUMN CLASSICS

The two-year-old autumn classics are the North Island Challenge Stakes at Trentham next week, and the following week the Sires Produce Stakes at Awapuni, while at Easter there will be the Champagne at Trentham and the New Zealand Cup and Challenge at Riccarton, but it will be at Auckland alone that this question of supremacy will be finally settled. In my opinion, Route March will prove the best filly to run on form, the second best, for the third position it is hard to say except that Burra Sahib is a contender, but back to last October form Foreign Coin might even finish up second best.

Diana Tetrix since she began racing as a two year old has been a consistent performer and has earned the reputation of being one of the most honest and courageous mares in commission in this part of the Dominion.

She has not been an outstanding performer by any means but she has not been given the opportunity as never has she been taken to the "town hall" meetings. Judging on the manner in which she decisively won from good average handicap class horses recently at Wairoa, Tolaga Bay, and Woodville this five-year-old mare should, when afforded the opportunity, win at more important meetings. Quite a few who finished behind her last Saturday in the Woodville Cup have won at our big fixtures.

BRED IN POVERTY BAY

She was bred by the late Mr. Galne Carrington at his stud in Poverty Bay and was submitted to public auction at the 1937 National Yearling Sales at Trentham and purchased by the late Mr. Thomas Roulston, an agent, for Mr. Ian Hamilton, for 60 guineas. The latter sportsman, after racing her for a few months, was obliged to go to England on business, so disposed of her to Mr. J. Svensen for, if memory is correct, 200 guineas. Mr. Hamilton showed real sportsmanship when he

sold his filly as she had not won a race for him and when he and Mr. Svensen, Wairoa, agreed to terms it was on the eve of the Hawke's Bay Jockey Club's 1938 New Year meeting where "Diana" was engaged, so Mr. Hamilton said if the filly did not race satisfactorily the next day Mr. Svensen could have his cheque back and cancel the sale. However, with the late Harold Young in the saddle she was first out (it is hardly necessary to say that with this barrier wizzer on top) and never headed won by two lengths, beating among others such good ultimate performers as Raka-hanga, Centrepole, Laughing Song and company so she passed into her present owner's hands who has never regretted clinching the sale.
