Form Reversals Hard To Explain

TOPSY-TURVY RUNNING

Wanganui Cup Meeting Opens On Thursday

(By THE BARB)

Never during this writer's many years' connection with racing on the Hastings racecourse has he seen so many reversals of form from one day to another as between last Thursday and Saturday. Not for one moment is it suggested, or even thought in any quarter, that this reversal was questionable, which is all the more remarkable.

There is an old saying "follow form and go broke", but that is accepted as only in theory, as form is the only reliable guide worked out correctly as regards distances, weights and the grade of the opposition.

From the very first race the form from the first day was upsetting. Queen's Dream was fourth on Thursday, eight lengths behind the winner, Malacca, over a mile and a-half run at about the rate of 14-16 to the furlong, and never looked like being in the money. On Saturday over a mile and three-quarters she won by two and a-half lengths galloping at the rate of 14sec. to the furlong, and what was more, was a winner before they had gone a mile and a-half. Thus the extra quarter cannot be said to have been the cause of her big improvement.

KHURJA'S CASE.

There may be a little excuse offered in Khurja's case, as he had not raced for some little time until last Thursday, and in the bridge certainly appeared as though he needed a race, while on Saturday he looked as though he had cleaned up a little by that public outing. The first day he finished eighth on Saturday he finished first on the issue like a good 'un to beat the first day's winner by a narrow margin. His form was not consistent but as though he needed a race, there is a reason for improvement which was expected and not kept a secret.

Lady Garvagah in the Maiden event the first day was never seen anywhere near the leaders, in fact it is doubtful if she was at any time nearer the front than eighth. On that day she was 14-10 in the betting in a field of 16 (there were 17 runners, but a bracket made betting needless one less) but when she succeeded her betting order was 7-9, so it looks that an improvement was anticipated. She was galloped on Saturday morning to show fast time, but nothing to make one confident. The extra half furlong and a better position throughout enabled her to win.

IMPROVED GREATLY.

In the Hawke's Bay Cup Lambourn was making heavy weather of it all the way, but it must be said that two or three times during the running Colonel Bogey came back on him, which upset his equilibrium to a marked extent. Never was he going like a likely place-getter, to finish in front of but a few. A complete reversal was seen in the Bulandshar race, with no collision on Saturday with no interference he was always galloping kindly, and reaching the straight was going like a train on and on and give nothing else a look-in and pass the post three lengths in front of the second horse in practically a second furlong in the time he ran in the Hawke's Bay Cup.
