


Christopher Gibbs as PROFESSOR HIGGINS


Patricia Aldersley as ELIZA DOOLITTLE




Doris Jensen as MRS HIGGINS

Carl Jamieson as FREDDY EYNSFORD-HILL



Gerald Brown as HARRY




