Live theatre has been in Diana's life for a long time, back stage, on stage and directing. She has been a member of Napier Rep for over twenty years (lived in Wellington for 12 of them). Since returning to Hawke's Bay, she has performed in *The Memory of Water*, directed *After you with the Milk* for *Deco Decanted*, appeared as Margot Buchanan in *Laying the Ghost* and Dotty in Theatre Hawkes Bay's *Noises Off*.

THE PLAYWRIGHT: Tudor Gates

Playwright, novelist, screenwriter, producer, director in film and theatre, Tudor Gates wrote the hugely successful *Ladies who Lunch* for amateur groups to perform as part of the British Tourist Biennial in 1998. He wrote and directed *The Dream of Geronimous Bosch* which won the British Drama League Award for the best One-Act Play. Among his film credits are *Barbarella* and the Peter Sellers film *The Optimists of Nine Elms*. He died in January in his 77th year.
