





Ross played the lead role of Horace var der Gelder in **The Matchmaker**, but his main school activity over the last five years has been debating. He has been almember of the senior team for three years.




GREG MATHESON PROFESSOR HIGGINS


JUNE WRIGHT MRS PEARCE
